3	Finance Committee to order. I'm going to
4	call the roll and act as clerk.
5	LEGISLATOR DENENBERG: Could you
6	just wait a second so some of the members
7	can come out?
8	CHAIRMAN NICOLELLO: I think
9	they're all here. Legislator
10	DeRiggi-Whitton?
11	LEGISLATOR DeRIGGI-WHITTON:
12	Here.
13	CHAIRMAN NICOLELLO: Legislator
14	Bosworth?
15	LEGISLATOR BOSWORTH: Here.
16	CHAIRMAN NICOLELLO: Ranking
17	Member Denenberg?
18	LEGISLATOR DENENBERG: Here.
19	CHAIRMAN NICOLELLO: Legislator
20	Walker?
21	LEGISLATOR WALKER: Here.
22	CHAIRMAN NICOLELLO: Legislator
23	Muscarella?
24	LEGISLATOR MUSCARELLA: Here.
25	CHAIRMAN NICOLELLO: Vice

- 2 Chairwoman Gonsalves?
- 3 LEGISLATOR GONSALVES: Here.
- 4 CHAIRMAN NICOLELLO: And I'm
- 5 here. We have a quorum. I'm going to call
- 6 the entire first page, Items 1, 2, 3, 4, 6,
- 7 7, 8, 9, 10 of 2012. 1-7 of 2012 are
- 8 resolutions to authorize the transfer of
- 9 appropriations heretofore made within the
- 10 budget for the year 2011.
- 11 Items 8, 9 and 10 are ordinances
- 12 supplemental to the annual appropriation
- 13 ordinance in connection with the Health
- 14 Department, Traffic Safety Board, and
- 15 Department of Social Services.
- 16 LEGISLATOR MUSCARELLA: So moved.
- 17 LEGISLATOR WALKER: Second.
- 18 CHAIRMAN NICOLELLO: Moved by
- 19 Legislator Muscarella, seconded by
- 20 Legislator Walker. Any discussion on these
- 21 items? Actually I have a couple of
- 22 questions myself on two of the items here.
- 23 Items 2 and 7.
- MR. CONROY: Happy New Year. Bob
- 25 Conroy, OMB, Office of Management and

- Finance Committee/1-9-12
- 2 Budget.
- 3 CHAIRMAN NICOLELLO: Item 2,
- 4 there were transfers in Item 2. There's an
- 5 approximate \$3 million transfer, in
- 6 particular, \$3 million transfer between
- 7 police headquarters fringe into salary.
- MR. CONROY: They are covering a
- 9 salary shortfall that they anticipated at
- 10 year end with excess they had in fringes, in
- 11 fringe benefits.
- 12 CHAIRMAN NICOLELLO: Item 7
- 13 involves a correctional center transfer of
- \$800,000.
- MR. SATHER: Good afternoon.
- 16 Captain Keith Sather, Nassau County
- 17 Correctional Center. The \$800,000 is
- 18 typical month 13 board transfer to cover
- 19 payroll expenses.
- 20 CHAIRMAN NICOLELLO: Any other
- 21 questions on these items? Legislator
- 22 Denenberg.
- 23 LEGISLATOR DENENBERG: Starting
- 24 with what the chairman was asking about.
- Number 2, that's actually \$3.9 million and

- Finance Committee/1-9-12
- 2 that's to cover salaries of Department of
- 3 Health?
- 4 CHAIRMAN NICOLELLO: No, \$3
- 5 million of that is police headquarters.
- 6 LEGISLATOR DENENBERG: So it was
- 7 taken from those departments and \$3 million
- 8 is for police headquarters?
- 9 MR. CONROY: Correct.
- 10 LEGISLATOR DENENBERG: Was that
- 11 overtime, to cover overtime?
- MR. CONROY: Primarily because
- 13 overtime is over budget.
- 14 LEGISLATOR DENENBERG: Do we have
- 15 a final number on where we were for police
- 16 overtime in 2011?
- MR. CONROY: We are still working
- 18 that up.
- 19 LEGISLATOR DENENBERG: I think at
- 20 budget time we were talking about \$52
- 21 million, could that have been correct?
- 22 MR. CONROY: I don't know where
- 23 we are with that now. I think through
- 24 November we were about \$5 million over
- 25 budget in the police department for

- Finance Committee/1-9-12
- 2 overtime.
- 3 LEGISLATOR DENENBERG: Only \$5
- 4 million over budget?
- MR. CONROY: Yes.
- 6 LEGISLATOR DENENBERG: I thought
- 7 we were like \$14 million over budget. In
- 8 fact, I'm sure -- I'm looking at my notes
- 9 and I think it was 52 and it was budgeted at
- 10 38. That would be \$14 million. We were
- 11 asking about that. A number of us were
- 12 asking about that because we were budgeting
- 13 I think only \$7 million for overtime for
- 14 '12.
- 15 MR. CONROY: That could be the
- 16 case. I'm going back to November. I don't
- 17 know where it winds up. We're still working
- 18 that up.
- 19 LEGISLATOR DENENBERG: So I would
- 20 like to know what the final number is, as we
- 21 make this board transfer to pay salaries,
- 22 mostly for overtime and police, I would like
- 23 to know what the final number was for
- 24 overtime in the police department and the
- 25 ongoing budget concern for this committee in

- 1 Finance Committee/1-9-12
- 2 particular is, if we were over \$52 million
- 3 last year, and now we have even less
- 4 officers, how can we possibly expect
- 5 overtime to go down to \$7 million?
- 6 This transfer alone is half of
- 7 what we budgeted for an entire year.
- 8 MR. CONROY: I'll get back to you
- 9 with that.
- 10 LEGISLATOR DENENBERG: You're
- 11 going to get back to me in what way? You're
- 12 going to send a letter to the chair and
- 13 ranking member?
- MR. CONROY: However you want.
- 15 CHAIRMAN NICOLELLO: You said the
- 16 numbers weren't finalized, right?
- MR. CONROY: Yes.
- 18 CHAIRMAN NICOLELLO: So myself
- 19 and ranking member, and I believe the two
- 20 leaders of the caucuses would be interested
- 21 in that information as soon as it's
- 22 available.
- MR. CONROY: Absolutely.
- 24 LEGISLATOR DENENBERG: Item
- 25 number 7 which is the \$800,000 transfer from

- Finance Committee/1-9-12
- 2 department of correction, general expenses
- 3 to the salary line, is that for overtime in
- 4 the correction department?
- 5 MR. SATHER: Yes, sir.
- 6 LEGISLATOR DENENBERG: So we had
- 7 the money in general expenses to cover the
- 8 overtime?
- 9 MR. SATHER: Yes, sir. We had a
- 10 surplus in both our general expenses and our
- 11 contractual expenses for 2011 that we were
- 12 able to move it over.
- 13 LEGISLATOR DENENBERG: What is
- 14 the amount for overtime in the Department of
- 15 Corrections for '11 at the present time?
- 16 MR. SATHER: At the present time
- 17 it does appear we will be coming in at or
- 18 close to budget, but because all the numbers
- 19 aren't in for month 13 yet, I can't give you
- 20 a definite answer.
- 21 LEGISLATOR DENENBERG: What did
- 22 we budget?
- 23 MR. SATHER: I believe we
- 24 budgeted 19.5.
- 25 LEGISLATOR DENENBERG: So my

- Finance Committee/1-9-12
- 2 question is, if we're on or close to budget,
- 3 why did we need the \$800,000 transfer?
- 4 MR. SATHER: First of all, the
- 5 \$800,000 right now, the overage is about
- 6 \$400,000. We're budgeting additional monies
- 7 in anticipation of covering any additional
- 8 expenses from month 13. As I said we are at
- 9 or close to budget. I don't have those
- 10 final numbers yet.
- 11 LEGISLATOR DENENBERG: What did
- 12 we budget for '12 in overtime in
- 13 connections?
- 14 MR. SATHER: I don't have that
- 15 number right now. I can get you that
- 16 number.
- 17 LEGISLATOR DENENBERG: Will it be
- 18 affected by the demotions that were within
- 19 the items that passed at the end of the year
- 20 after the budget?
- MR. SATHER: Sir, I'm not here to
- 22 answer those questions today. I'm here to
- 23 answer questions on this line transfer.
- 24 LEGISLATOR DENENBERG: Well, we
- 25 are making a transfer to cover for overtime

- Finance Committee/1-9-12
- 2 so I'm concerned about overtime last year
- 3 and I'm also concerned about overtime within
- 4 the budget this year, and I know that a
- 5 number of people were demoted from corporal,
- 6 or -- we approved, the legislature approved
- 7 an item to demote people. I'm wondering how
- 8 that would affect our overtime.
- 9 MR. SATHER: I can only answer
- 10 questions on the line transfer for the 2011
- 11 budget, sir.
- 12 LEGISLATOR DENENBERG: I would
- 13 ask that, Mr. Nicolello, as chairman, I do
- 14 know that there was someone -- John
- 15 Jaronczyk had been here to speak about -- he
- 16 had a public comment that he tried to make
- 17 in the Public Safety Committee but it
- 18 relates to certainly the corrections
- 19 department as well as overtime expenses in
- 20 the corrections department. So I would ask
- 21 that he be allowed to speak now.
- 22 CHAIRMAN NICOLELLO: Number one,
- 23 Mr. Jaronczyk is perfectly capable of
- 24 speaking for himself. Number two, we are
- 25 dealing with a single transfer right now.

- 1 Finance Committee/1-9-12
- 2 If this individual before us has knowledge
- 3 of the transfer, you're getting into global
- 4 issues that he's not here to testify about.
- 5 So if you have any other
- 6 questions about this particular transfer,
- 7 then you can feel free to speak about that.
- 8 LEGISLATOR DENENBERG: Let me
- 9 just close by saying this. This \$800,000
- 10 that we are transferring, you're saying, let
- 11 me just be clear, that that stays within
- 12 what we had budgeted, correct?
- MR. SATHER: Correct. It's an
- 14 internal transfer and has no impact on our
- 15 operational budget.
- 16 LEGISLATOR DENENBERG: But if we
- 17 had budgeted enough for overtime or within
- 18 our 19.5 for overtime, why do we need to
- 19 transfer this to the salary line?
- MR. SATHER: As I said, we are
- 21 close to budget, but there is going to be
- 22 some overage which we have taken from other
- 23 areas, other lines within our budget.
- 24 LEGISLATOR DENENBERG: So then is
- 25 it safe to say, if we budgeted 19.5 we are

- Finance Committee/1-9-12
- 2 at about 20.3 at least by transferring the
- 3 \$800,000?
- 4 MR. SATHER: No, sir. I would
- 5 say closer to 19.8, 19.9. But, again, month
- 6 13 is not over yet so I don't have all the
- 7 final figures. This is typical for this
- 8 time of year that these adjustments have to
- 9 be made in the budget.
- 10 LEGISLATOR DENENBERG: I'll hear
- 11 your answer but it just seems to me that if
- 12 you were at or close to budget, I'm not sure
- 13 why we need the board transfer. Thank you.
- 14 CHAIRMAN NICOLELLO: Do we have
- 15 any further questions?
- 16 LEGISLATOR DERIGGI-WHITTON: Can
- 17 I just ask one question? You mentioned that
- 18 \$400,000 is going to be covering potential
- 19 overtime, correct, out of this,
- 20 approximately that much?
- MR. SATHER: Correct.
- 22 LEGISLATOR DERIGGI-WHITTON: Do
- 23 you have any idea what the other 400 might
- 24 be used for for the end of the year?
- MR. SATHER: No, at this point,

- Finance Committee/1-9-12
- 2 the additional monies we are asking for are
- 3 in anticipation of any other overages, but
- 4 it would not necessarily have to be used.
- 5 LEGISLATOR DERIGGI-WHITTON: What
- 6 type of overages are those, just typically?
- 7 MR. SATHER: There could be
- 8 additional overtime that has not been
- 9 entered. We also had, on the last paycheck,
- 10 we had one day of that paycheck that was
- 11 still in 2011, things like that that could
- 12 affect the salary line.
- 13 CHAIRMAN NICOLELLO: Legislator
- 14 Bosworth.
- 15 LEGISLATOR BOSWORTH: Legislator
- 16 Nicolello, I understand that we have to
- 17 limit ourselves to talking about what an
- 18 item on the agenda is, and this is about a
- 19 transfer, but it is a transfer that's being
- 20 made in the correctional department.
- So I guess my question to you is,
- 22 when is it appropriate to speak about what
- 23 occurred at the jail this weekend?
- 24 CHAIRMAN NICOLELLO: I can only
- 25 speak for the Finance Committee. It's not

- Finance Committee/1-9-12
- 2 something that is before this committee and
- 3 doesn't have a financial implication.
- 4 I think that's something that
- 5 really should be discussed with Kevan and
- 6 discuss with the presiding officer and maybe
- 7 there will be a time at the Full Legislature
- 8 or something like that.
- 9 But with respect to the Finance
- 10 Committee, it's certainly not something we
- 11 should be discussing when we are just
- 12 talking about transfers.
- 13 LEGISLATOR BOSWORTH: I know, but
- 14 it's a transfer in relationship to staffing.
- 15 So I don't think it's like a tremendous leap
- 16 to think that perhaps it would be something
- 17 that would appropriate to discuss. I
- 18 respect what you're saying, but that's why
- 19 I'm asking when the appropriate time is.
- 20 Because, to me, this has to do with
- 21 staffing.
- 22 CHAIRMAN NICOLELLO: If you want
- 23 to make that connection, you could connect
- 24 everything to finance. Every operation in
- 25 this county has an impact, has a

- Finance Committee/1-9-12
- 2 relationship to finance. I think we need to
- 3 narrow our focus, at least just for this
- 4 particular committee. Obviously there's
- 5 many other opportunities and forums to do
- 6 what you want to do, speak about that. I
- 7 think we are all interested to find out that
- 8 information.
- 9 LEGISLATOR BOSWORTH: Again, I
- 10 understand what you're saying and I'm
- 11 looking to you as an experienced legislator
- 12 to ask you --
- 13 CHAIRMAN NICOLELLO: I think
- 14 Newsday called me an elder statesman, by the
- 15 way.
- 16 LEGISLATOR BOSWORTH: The
- 17 unkindest cut of all, right? But the
- 18 question is, where would it be appropriate
- 19 to address this?
- 20 CHAIRMAN NICOLELLO: It's a good
- 21 question. We can discuss that and figure
- 22 this out between ourselves. But, really,
- 23 this is not the right forum. The focus for
- 24 this is strictly finance and it's really --
- 25 the information that you're going to gather

- Finance Committee/1-9-12
- 2 will go to the operation of the correctional
- 3 center and policy issues, such as that. I
- 4 agree, we need to find out that information.
- 5 We are all interested in it. But this isn't
- 6 the right place.
- 7 LEGISLATOR BOSWORTH: I believe
- 8 we are all interested in it and that's the
- 9 underlying reason for the question. I was
- 10 just trying to figure out where it would be
- 11 appropriate to speak to it.
- 12 CHAIRMAN NICOLELLO: I think the
- 13 Full Legislature is the place to do it.
- 14 LEGISLATOR BOSWORTH: So you're
- 15 saying Full Legislature because people have
- 16 the opportunity for public comment, but --
- 17 CHAIRMAN NICOLELLO: I don't have
- 18 the authority to say that, but that's one of
- 19 19, that's my reasoning. That's the place
- 20 to do it, there.
- 21 LEGISLATOR BOSWORTH: Okay.
- 22 LEGISLATOR DENENBERG: I would
- 23 just note on this record what I noted in
- 24 Public Safety, that it is a public safety
- 25 issue and, yet, it was clearly within the

- Finance Committee/1-9-12
- 2 purview of public safety to hear public
- 3 comment on what occurred over the weekend
- 4 and on safety at the jail, and they chose
- 5 not to.
- 6 CHAIRMAN NICOLELLO: Are there
- 7 any other questions on this particular item?
- 8 Legislator Denenberg, Muscarella makes a
- 9 good point also. Before we wade into
- 10 something like this, we should make sure we
- 11 understand there could be litigation and, if
- 12 you make statements on the record, and that
- 13 item, such as this, and it comes back in a
- 14 financial capacity to haunt the county, we
- 15 have been considering settlement of one
- 16 matter involving Joanna Bird, and I recall
- 17 distinctly right after that happened, the
- 18 then county executive was in the media
- 19 making statements, and the police
- 20 commissioner at the time, which ultimately,
- 21 if this case does or did go to trial, would
- 22 have come back to haunt the county.
- 23 So before we start making
- 24 statements, we should just be very careful
- 25 about this. But I understand what you're

- 2 talking --
- 3 LEGISLATOR DENENBERG: I was
- 4 talking about public comment. Public
- 5 comment is public comment. That doesn't
- 6 hold us to liability at all. It's public
- 7 comment.
- 8 CHAIRMAN NICOLELLO: That's true.
- 9 Do we have any further questions on these
- 10 items?
- 11 (No verbal response.)
- 12 Is there any public comment? Mr.
- 13 Jaronczyk, thank you for coming.
- 14 MR. JARONCZYK: Good afternoon.
- 15 My name is John Jaronczyk. I'm the
- 16 president of the Sheriff's Officer
- 17 Association.
- 18 CHAIRMAN NICOLELLO: If you want
- 19 to discuss this board transfer, you're more
- 20 than welcome to do that.
- 21 MR. JARONCZYK: I actually have
- 22 some questions, and I want to clarify some
- 23 comments that Legislator Denenberg had that
- 24 Captain Sather did not have information for.
- 25 I realize that I'm before the Finance

- Finance Committee/1-9-12
- 2 Committee. I would just like to say for the
- 3 record that I find it disturbing --
- 4 actually, I find it disgusting that the
- 5 Public Safety Committee of the Nassau County
- 6 Legislature does not want to hear about an
- 7 incident and about budget cuts that affect
- 8 everyone that works inside, inmates,
- 9 officers and visitors at the correctional
- 10 center.
- 11 CHAIRMAN NICOLELLO: Thank you,
- 12 Mr. Jaronczyk, but, again, if you want to
- 13 talk about the board transfer, you're more
- 14 than welcome to do that.
- MR. JARONCZYK: Thank you.
- 16 CHAIRMAN NICOLELLO: If you want
- 17 to start getting into what the Public Safety
- 18 Committee should or should not do, you can
- 19 do that in another forum. We have an agenda
- 20 and we're going to proceed with that agenda.
- 21 MR. JARONCZYK: I appreciate that
- 22 and I attempted to, but they did not want to
- 23 hear me. Getting back to this movement of
- 24 the money, my question is, how does this
- 25 affect the demotions? Now, Legislator

- Finance Committee/1-9-12
- 2 Denenberg said that there were demotions
- 3 made at the jail. I would just like to say,
- 4 for the record, there were no demotions made
- 5 at the jail, there were none made, but they
- 6 are impending, they are looming.
- 7 LEGISLATOR DENENBERG: If I --
- 8 CHAIRMAN NICOLELLO: No, no.
- 9 Wait a second. Wait a second.
- 10 LEGISLATOR DENENBERG: I just
- 11 want to say for the record, I didn't say
- 12 there were demotions yet, I said that the
- 13 legislature had approved the demotions.
- 14 CHAIRMAN NICOLELLO: Thanks for
- 15 the clarification. We have an item before
- 16 us in the transfers. We had an individual
- 17 who was able to speak to those transfers.
- 18 The issues as to demotions and to overtime
- 19 for next year, he was not able to address.
- 20 If at a future meeting we have someone who
- 21 can speak to those things, then fine, but
- 22 right now, let's confine ourselves to this
- 23 board transfer.
- Mr. Jaronczyk, if you have
- 25 something to say --

3	\$800,000 in money affect the demotions at
4	all?
5	CHAIRMAN NICOLELLO: No, it's
6	fairly clear, it's crystal clear that
7	MR. JARONCZYK: Crystal clear?
8	CHAIRMAN NICOLELLO: Yes. It's
9	2011. It affects the 2011 budget for this
10	department.
11	MR. JARONCZYK: And Legislator
12	Denenberg had a question about the overtime
13	budget for 2012, that number is \$14.5
14	million. \$5 million less than 2011. So
15	Captain Sather could not give that
16	information, but it's \$5 million less.
17	CHAIRMAN NICOLELLO: Thank you.
18	Do we have any further public comment?
19	(No verbal response.)
20	Hearing none, all those in favor,
21	signify by saying aye.
22	(Aye.)
23	Any opposed?
24	(No verbal response.)

Those items carry unanimously.
