CHAIRWOMAN GONSALVES: Thank you

- 2 very much. We have one item on the regular
- 3 agenda, that's Item 640-12.
- 4 LEGISLATOR DUNNE: So moved.
- 5 LEGISLATOR NICOLELLO: Second.
- 6 CHAIRWOMAN GONSALVES: Moved by
- 7 Legislator Dunne, seconded by Legislator
- 8 Nicolello. Who do we have here to speak on
- 9 this item?
- 10 MR. SCHNEIDER: Good afternoon.
- 11 Brian Schneider from Public Works. This
- 12 item is an inter-Nassau agreement with the
- 13 Town of Oyster Bay for the formation of an
- 14 Oyster Bay/Cold Spring Harbor Protection
- 15 Committee.
- 16 The Town of Oyster Bay will act
- 17 as the administrator for this program. The
- 18 Town of Oyster Bay will pay a coordinator
- 19 which consists of many villages along the
- 20 north shore which will conform to the storm
- 21 water management program for Nassau County.
- 22 It allows for a payment of \$9,750 towards
- 23 the committee.
- 24 This is an annual payment for
- 25 storm water management work that will be

- 2 done by the committee.
- 3 CHAIRWOMAN GONSALVES: Any
- 4 legislators have any questions? Mr.
- 5 Denenberg.
- 6 LEGISLATOR DENENBERG: When you
- 7 say "annual payment," that's every year for
- 8 how long?
- 9 MR. SCHNEIDER: It's an ongoing
- 10 program similar to the payments to the
- 11 Hempstead Harbor Protection Committee and
- 12 the Manhasset Bay Protection Committee. The
- 13 county has made contributions to those
- 14 committees on an annual basis. It's been
- 15 going on for Hempstead Harbor and Manhasset
- 16 Bay for the last ten to 12 years. This is
- 17 the first year of the Oyster Bay Protection
- 18 Committee.
- 19 LEGISLATOR DENENBERG: My
- 20 question was, how much is it and for how
- long?
- MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, this is a
- one year agreement for \$9,750. We will have
- 24 to come every year to either amend this IMA
- 25 for our contribution going forward.

3	funding comes out of what?
4	MR. SCHNEIDER: It comes out of
5	our county storm water one of our capital
6	projects, 82010, which is for storm water
7	management.
8	LEGISLATOR DENENBERG: Okay.
9	CHAIRWOMAN GONSALVES: Any other
10	questions from the legislators?
11	(No verbal response.)
12	Is there any public comment?
13	(No verbal response.)
14	There being none, all those in
15	favor of this motion signify by saying aye.
16	(Aye.)
17	Any opposed?
18	(No verbal response.)
19	The motion carries unanimously.
20	It moves on and it moves on to finance. Now
21	we have an addendum. I need a motion to
22	suspend the rules.
23	LEGISLATOR JACOBS: So moved.
24	LEGISLATOR DUNNE: Second.
25	CHAIRWOMAN GONSALVES: Moved by

- 3 Dunne. The item is 645-12 and I don't know
- 4 if you would like to read it. All those in
- 5 favor of suspending the rules signify by

- 8 Any opposed?

- None. Okay. The item is 645-12.
- 11 We vote on this item and then I believe
- 12 there is an amendment to this item as well.
- 13 We made the motion for this. So we've had
- 14 legislator I believe Jacobs and I believe
- 15 Legislator Dunne.
- 16 This ordinance has an amendment
- 17 in the nature of a substitution. So I would
- 18 like to make a motion to amend this item.
- 19 LEGISLATOR DUNNE: So moved.
- 20 LEGISLATOR JACOBS: Second.
- 21 CHAIRWOMAN GONSALVES: Moved by
- 22 Legislator Dunne, seconded by Legislator
- 23 Jacobs. So the amendment in the nature of a
- 24 substitution to this item is -- who is going
- 25 to read it for me?

- CLERK MULLER: I'll read it.
- 3 645-12, an ordinance making certain
- 4 determinations pursuant to the State
- 5 Environmental Quality Review Act and
- 6 authorizing the county executive on behalf
- 7 of the County of Nassau to execute the lease
- 8 between the County of Nassau as tenant and
- 9 89 Jamaica Realty Company LLC in connection
- 10 with a lease of real property known as Block
- 11 9795, Lot 65 on the tax map of the City of
- 12 New York located at 89th Avenue and Merrick
- 13 Boulevard in Jamaica, Borough of Queens,
- 14 City of New York, State of New York.
- 15 For those of you who want to know
- 16 what was amended, the original item did not
- 17 have a lease attached to it, and that's why
- 18 we amended the item. Am I correct, Mr.
- 19 Kelly?
- MR. KELLY: Yes, that's correct.
- 21 Michael Kelly, acting director, Nassau
- 22 County Department of Public Works, Division
- 23 of Real Estate Services.
- Item 645-12 is to authorize the
- 25 county executive to execute a lease between

- 2 the county and 89 Jamaica Realty Company,
- 3 LLC. This lease is for six bus bays located
- 4 at the Jamaica bus terminal at the corner of
- 5 89th Avenue and Merrick Boulevard in
- 6 Jamaica, Queens.
- 7 The lease will be for a period of
- 8 five years commencing from July 1st, 2012
- 9 and ending five years later with an
- 10 extension option to bring to March 31st,
- 11 2021.
- 12 The cost for the lease is
- 13 \$175,000 for the first year increasing three
- 14 percent in future years with a tax payment
- of \$30,000 in the first year increasing
- 16 three percent in future years. This is for
- 17 the continued occupancy of the bus bays by
- 18 Nassau County's bus system operated by
- 19 Veolia Transportation System.
- 20 CHAIRWOMAN GONSALVES: Any
- 21 legislators have any questions? Legislator
- 22 Nicolello.
- 23 LEGISLATOR NICOLELLO: Mr. Kelly,
- 24 why wouldn't Veolia pay this directly?
- 25 MR. KELLY: This is a county

- 2 expense under Veolia's contract. The county
- 3 either owns or leases all of the properties
- 4 that the bus operates on. So one of the
- 5 provisions in our contract was, there are
- 6 certain non-county properties, one being
- 7 also Roosevelt Field, there is a bus
- 8 terminal there, that we would provide to
- 9 them in order to operate the bus system.
- 10 This is just one of those properties.
- 11 LEGISLATOR NICOLELLO: Was the
- 12 MTA leasing the bays?
- MR. KELLY: The MTA was
- 14 continuing from an expired lease on this
- 15 property dating back to 1936. There was a
- 16 recent change in ownership in the realty
- 17 company that owns the property so we were
- 18 approached about finalizing a new lease on
- 19 the property as that one -- could be
- 20 continued --
- 21 LEGISLATOR NICOLELLO: Do we know
- 22 how much the MTA was paying for it?
- 23 MR. KELLY: The MTA was paying a
- 24 nominal amount for that period of about \$400
- 25 per month. They also have another lease of

- 2 property right next to it under similar
- 3 terms, but they're also paying less money on
- 4 that one. That one was entered into in
- 5 1991.
- 6 LEGISLATOR NICOLELLO: The
- 7 alternative would be to what?
- 8 MR. KELLY: The alternative would
- 9 be to put the buses pretty much back on the
- 10 street or find an alternative location,
- 11 being Jamaica Queens is a congested place.
- 12 It's not really the place to put buses on
- 13 the street. There are crowded sidewalks,
- 14 subway stations, things like that.
- 15 LEGISLATOR NICOLELLO: This
- 16 location is easily accessible by someone
- 17 taking a subway so they could just walk
- 18 right to the --
- MR. KELLY: Well, the subways
- 20 are located I believe on 165th Street and
- 21 Hillside Avenue, and this is also close by
- 22 the Jamaica Long Island Railroad terminal,
- 23 about ten blocks away.
- 24 LEGISLATOR NICOLELLO: Thank you.
- 25 CHAIRWOMAN GONSALVES: Legislator

Planning & Development Committee/10-15-12 2 Ford. 3 LEGISLATOR FORD: Are there any 4 other properties that we're going to be 5 paying leases on for the NICE system? 6 MR. KELLY: This is right now one The other is the Roosevelt Field 7 of two. 8 terminal which we pay a small amount for maintaining the blacktop, but that's the 9 10 only other one that we have for now. 11 LEGISLATOR FORD: Thank you. 12 CHAIRWOMAN GONSALVES: Any other 13 comments or questions from any of the legislators? 14 15 (No verbal response.) 16 Is there any public comment? 17 (No verbal response.) 18 All those in favor of this item 19 as amended signify by saying aye. 20 (Aye.)
