- 6 there was a little uptick in crime.
- 7 CHAIRMAN DUNNE: I read in the
- 8 Seaford paper and the Levittown paper that
- 9 we had an increase in burglaries but I
- 10 understand you are catching --
- 11 SERGEANT STEPHANOFF: Well, they
- 12 put a team together, and we do intelligence
- 13 based policing. So they also put a team
- 14 together to combat the crime.
- 15 CHAIRMAN DUNNE: You caught
- 16 somebody in Westbury also?
- 17 SERGEANT STEPHANOFF: Yes.
- 18 CHAIRMAN DUNNE: So you're doing
- 19 a great job and, if this money helps it,
- 20 that's great. 624 is also called.
- 21 SERGEANT STEPHANOFF: 624 is a
- 22 justice assistance grant for \$136,582. This
- 23 is going to be used also for overtime
- 24 associated with specialized patrols in
- 25 connection with various programs.

- 9 is to create a more data driven environment
- 10 in which Nassau can continue to improve
- 11 outcomes for at risk youth, while more
- 12 efficiently utilizing scarce resources.
