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- 2 CHAIRMAN KOPEL: Government
- 3 Services and Operations come to order. I'm
- 4 going to call the roll. Legislator Ford?
- 5 LEGISLATOR FORD: Here.
- 6 CHAIRMAN KOPEL: Legislator
- 7 Becker?
- 8 LEGISLATOR BECKER: Present.
- 9 CHAIRMAN KOPEL: Sitting in for
- 10 Legislator Dunne, Legislator Walker?
- 11 LEGISLATOR WALKER: Here.
- 12 CHAIRMAN KOPEL: Legislator Wink?
- 13 LEGISLATOR WINK: Here.
- 14 CHAIRMAN KOPEL: Legislator
- 15 Denenberg?
- 16 LEGISLATOR DENENBERG: Here.
- 17 CHAIRMAN KOPEL: Legislator
- 18 Troiano?
- 19 LEGISLATOR TROIANO: Here.
- 20 CHAIRMAN KOPEL: Okay. We've got
- 21 one item on the calendar and that is 94 of
- 22 '12, an ordinance supplemental to the annual
- 23 appropriation ordinance in connection with
- 24 the Office of Housing Community Development.
- 25 May I have a motion, please?

- 2 LEGISLATOR BECKER: So moved.
- 3 LEGISLATOR WALKER: Second.
- 4 CHAIRMAN KOPEL: Moved by
- 5 Legislator Becker, seconded by Legislator
- 6 Walker. Who is here to speak on this?
- 7 MR. MARIN: Good evening,
- 8 legislators. Robert Marin, chief counsel.
- 9 This is an annual appropriation from HUD
- 10 for \$339,260 for a housing initiative to
- 11 help affordable housing. We intake clients.
- 12 The difference with this grant from our
- 13 other grants is the purpose of this grant is
- 14 to help individuals through counseling to
- 15 get back on their feet so that this does not
- 16 become a recurring or lifetime supplement
- 17 like unfortunately so many of our programs
- 18 are. So it helps with rent, one time costs,
- 19 provides counseling and helps them to try to
- 20 get back on their feet.
- 21 That is also the criteria for
- 22 eligibility is that you have to be, if you
- 23 will, viable for lack of a better term,
- 24 speaking very bluntly and frankly, a
- 25 candidate to be self-sustaining within a

- 2 reasonable period of time. So that it is
- 3 that type of program as opposed to something
- 4 that becomes recurring.
- 5 CHAIRMAN KOPEL: Fully funded by
- 6 HUD?
- 7 MR. MARIN: Yes.
- 8 CHAIRMAN KOPEL: Any questions?
- 9 LEGISLATOR FORD: Yes.
- 10 CHAIRMAN KOPEL: Legislator Ford.
- 11 LEGISLATOR FORD: Good evening.
- 12 How many clients are you working with right
- 13 now, do you have a number?
- MR. MARIN: Right now I don't
- 15 have an exact number. I know it's a limited
- 16 number. It's limited funds that we have and
- 17 within that budget there are only a number
- 18 of limited people that we can help. I don't
- 19 have the exact number off the top of my
- 20 head.
- 21 LEGISLATOR FORD: But you said
- 22 this is basically a new type of a program?
- MR. MARIN: It's a new
- 24 initiative. It's a hybrid, if you will,
- 25 from a Section 8 program, rental assistance

- 2 rental subsidy program in that -- the
- 3 criteria is viability so it does not become
- 4 a lifetime subsidy for an individual.
- 5 LEGISLATOR FORD: Considering
- 6 that Section 8 vouchers are very hard to
- 7 get, you know --
- 8 MR. MARIN: The list is closed,
- 9 since 2003.
- 10 LEGISLATOR FORD: So for somebody
- 11 who may be on the list for Section 8, but
- 12 they're not at that point to be able to
- 13 maybe take over Section 8 voucher that was
- 14 abandoned by somebody else, all right? Is
- 15 this something that could help somebody like
- 16 that?
- MR. MARIN: Possibly.
- 18 LEGISLATOR FORD: That they can
- 19 come down for some sort of training and to
- 20 just basically, if they can demonstrate that
- 21 they have a job, maybe by having a certain
- 22 amount of funding for a short period of
- 23 time, were they able to find housing and be
- 24 able to get themselves established?
- MR. MARIN: Yes. That would be

- 2 the goal of that. It's a short term shot in
- 3 the arm program, if you will. Shot in the
- 4 arm of funding, if you will.
- 5 LEGISLATOR FORD: Thank you.
- 6 CHAIRMAN KOPEL: Any other
- 7 legislators have questions? Legislator
- 8 Troiano.
- 9 LEGISLATOR TROIANO: It's just
- 10 not clear to me, is the program providing
- 11 rent supplements in addition to education
- 12 and counseling and advocacy, or --
- MR. MARIN: Yes. It's a more
- 14 complete program, whereas in the Section 8
- 15 program it's strictly income eligibility,
- 16 strictly rent subsidy and you can have it
- 17 for life as long as you meet the income
- 18 eligibility criteria.
- 19 LEGISLATOR TROIANO: Is there an
- 20 income test here as well?
- MR. MARIN: Yes, there is an
- 22 income threshold. It's the same income
- 23 threshold but it's also in addition to --
- 24 all of our programs, all of our programs
- 25 always have an income threshold. Generally

- 2 it's no higher than 80 percent of the area
- 3 income for Nassau County, that's as a
- 4 general rule for all of the programs, some
- 5 are lower but, as a general rule, yes, it's
- 6 always income eligible, in addition to
- 7 income eligibility on this program, it's
- 8 also, again, viability, for lack of a better
- 9 term, in terms of showing that you have
- 10 income sustainability and the ability to be
- 11 self sufficient in a reasonable period of
- 12 time.
- 13 LEGISLATOR TROIANO: What's a
- 14 reasonable period of time?
- MR. MARIN: It's discretion.
- 16 It's usually a year, six months. That's
- 17 really up to the counselors in accordance
- 18 with the regulations.
- 19 LEGISLATOR TROIANO: So if after
- let's say a year someone hasn't graduated,
- 21 do they get dropped?
- 22 MR. MARIN: Yes. This is a
- 23 finite -- this is designed to be finite for
- 24 the reasons stated and also simply because
- 25 the funding does run out. It's not a --

- 2 like the Section 8 program is funded
- 3 annually, this may not be. This may not be.
- 4 LEGISLATOR TROIANO: Thank you.
- 5 CHAIRMAN KOPEL: Anyone else?
- 6 Yes, Legislator Walker.
- 7 LEGISLATOR WALKER: And basically
- 8 this program would help someone who is
- 9 really not eligible for Section 8 for the
- 10 most part?
- MR. MARIN: When you say "not
- 12 eligible "it's ineligible because the list
- is closed so it's really not an available
- 14 option at this point. The list has been
- 15 closed since I think 2003. The Section 8
- 16 option is really not an option.
- 17 This would be an intermediary
- 18 were Section 8 available between Section 8
- 19 and going to DSS for emergency housing
- 20 placement. This is one step above that and
- 21 one step below Section 8 in terms of the
- 22 program. Where Section 8 is lifetime, and
- 23 DSS is emergency, this falls in the middle.
- 24 So if I made it worse and confused everybody
- 25 by saying that, I apologize.
