- 7 LEGISLATOR MUSCARELLA: So moved.
- 8 LEGISLATOR BECKER: Second.
- 9 CLERK MULLER: Moved by

- MR. MAY: Chairwoman, would it be

- 25 MR. MAY: We have Commissioner

- 3 Services to answer any questions on these
- 4 items.
- 5 LEGISLATOR JACOBS: Happy New
- 6 Year.
- 7 COMMISSIONER MURPHY: Happy New
- 8 Year.
- 9 LEGISLATOR JACOBS: Just a quick
- 10 question. You weren't here the last time
- 11 when I mentioned in light of the tragedy in
- 12 the Connecticut in all, that since we were
- 13 able to identify through OLBR certain
- 14 additional funds that were still in the old
- 15 budget, that we were hoping that mental
- 16 health could be built up further to enable
- 17 us to look at that facet.
- I mean, I know gun control is
- 19 very important, but the other end of that is
- 20 mental health services. There was a big
- 21 dip, and I don't have my information with me
- 22 right now because I'm not usually on this
- 23 committee.
- 24 COMMISSIONER MURPHY: Let me
- 25 clarify that. There was what appeared to be

- 1 Health/Social Services 1-7-13
- 2 a big dip, but you should really be very
- 3 happy to hear that it really was a not a big
- 4 dip in mental health services.
- 5 What we actually did was,
- 6 basically all of our mental health services
- 7 at this point have been moved over, the bulk
- 8 of them, to the grant fund.
- 9 So the numbers that you saw were
- 10 reflected from the general fund but most of
- 11 our money in mental health was actually in
- 12 the grant fund and remains in the grant
- 13 fund.
- In fact, we have not cut any
- 15 mental health program that had previously
- 16 existed. We had thought to implement some
- 17 new programs and, unfortunately, those were
- 18 the programs that were cut in the 2012
- 19 budget. But they had never actually been
- 20 implemented and there had never been a
- 21 contract there. Those were monies that we
- 22 were hoping to be able to use and
- 23 facilitate. But, in actuality, those
- 24 programs were never funded in that way.
- 25 LEGISLATOR JACOBS: So you feel

2	fairly confident that 2013, the programs
3	that are in place will be in place?
4	COMMISSIONER MURPHY: Yes. We
5	have the same number of programs and, in
6	fact, we will end up probably with an
7	additional \$200,000 in mental health
8	services for the year 2013 over those
9	programs that we had in the year 2012.
10	LEGISLATOR JACOBS: That's good
11	to hear. I think it's just something that
12	we should not that any of us didn't give
13	proper due diligence to, but I think it's
14	pretty obvious that that's a factor that
15	everyone talks about now as far as what can
16	be done, besides gun control, what can you
17	do? It's got to be mental health.
18	COMMISSIONER MURPHY: And I would
19	encourage everyone to advocate with Albany
20	and the federal government because I believe
21	Senator Skelos had something in the paper
22	recently on that as well, we do, we need
23	more money for things like Kendra's Law, I
24	agree 100 percent with you, Legislator

Jacobs, there's no question about it.

25

- 2 But you should be assured that we
- 3 have the same level, in fact, actually more
- 4 this year than we did last year.
- 5 COMMISSIONER MURPHY: I'm
- 6 definitely committing right now that towards
- 7 the end of this year, when we are talking
- 8 budget, I will join with you if you are so
- 9 inclined to fight for more money for mental
- 10 health because, I'll tell you what scares
- 11 me, when it goes into the grant fund,
- 12 there's a chance, I hope it never happens,
- 13 that those grants don't come through.
- 14 COMMISSIONER MURPHY: You are 100
- 15 percent correct.
- 16 LEGISLATOR JACOBS: And if they
- 17 don't, there go the cuts.
- 18 COMMISSIONER MURPHY: I would
- 19 welcome your partnership in advocating that.
- 20 LEGISLATOR JACOBS: Well, I'm
- 21 going to and I wish there was a way we can
- 22 find some right now to even increase it
- 23 more.
- 24 COMMISSIONER MURPHY: Thank you.
- 25 CLERK MULLER: I think Legislator

- 1 Health/Social Services 1-7-13
- 2 DeRiggi-Whitton would like to speak.
- 3 LEGISLATOR DERIGGI-WHITTON: Do
- 4 you have a list of the programs that you had
- 5 slated to be started in 2013 that are not
- 6 going to be?
- 7 COMMISSIONER MURPHY: I can
- 8 supply you with that. I don't have it right
- 9 here with me presently. Basically, though,
- 10 those programs were programs that were
- 11 operating and that we are continuing to
- 12 fund. It was just that several
- organizations were promised. We were
- 14 hoping, not promised, but that we were
- 15 hoping to be able to give them additional
- 16 revenue, an additional 25 to \$30,000 extra
- 17 dollars that we were not able to. But I
- 18 will supply you with that information.
- 19 LEGISLATOR DERIGGI-WHITTON: Okay.
- 20 So just to clarify what you said before, you
- 21 just mentioned there were programs that you
- 22 wanted to start but you were unable to do
- now.
- 24 COMMISSIONER MURPHY: Yes. There
- 25 were one or two that we were hoping to

- 2 start, and, you know, we are still hopeful
- 3 that somewhere we will find the funds to do
- 4 that, but that's really just to enhance
- 5 programs that we already have.
- 6 LEGISLATOR DERIGGI-WHITTON: But,
- 7 again, as Judy said, it would be something,
- 8 we would just like to see what your --
- 9 COMMISSIONER MURPHY: Absolutely.
- 10 No problem. I will get you that
- 11 information.
- 12 CHAIRWOMAN WALKER: Legislator
- 13 Troiano.
- 14 LEGISLATOR TROIANO: Sorry to
- 15 make you speak. Thank you.
- 16 Just drawing your attention to
- 17 24-13, which is a program that takes \$22
- 18 million from the state and gives it to
- 19 alcohol and drug dependency programs.
- 20 COMMISSIONER MURPHY: Correct.
- 21 LEGISLATOR TROIANO: It indicates
- 22 that there are some 38 medically supervised
- 23 outpatient programs?
- 24 COMMISSIONER MURPHY: Yes.
- 25 LEGISLATOR TROIANO: Do you have

- 1 Health/Social Services 1-7-13
- 2 a listing of what those programs are, where
- 3 they are?
- 4 COMMISSIONER MURPHY: Again, I
- 5 can supply you with that, but they are
- 6 essentially community based programs that
- 7 county wide and they are community based as
- 8 well as school based. So high schools and
- 9 some middle schools throughout the county.
- 10 But I will get you that information.
- 11 LEGISLATOR TROIANO: And if you
- 12 can't identify today the specific programs
- 13 and where they are, do you have a general
- 14 feeling for where they are disbursed
- 15 throughout the county?
- 16 COMMISSIONER MURPHY: Well, we
- 17 are looking at -- for the community based
- 18 programs that are funded in our drug and
- 19 alcohol programs, those are ones where we
- 20 have the greatest number of at risk
- 21 population and I can give you a basic
- 22 listing; we have Plainview, Old Bethpage
- 23 School District, we have port counseling
- 24 center, we have Port Washington School
- 25 District, Rockville Centre School District,

- 1 Health/Social Services 1-7-13
- 2 Roosevelt Educational Alcohol. That's that
- 3 React Program in Roosevelt. We have the
- 4 Roosevelt Union School District, we have
- 5 South Shore Child Guidance, Southeast Nassau
- 6 Guidance Center, Substance Abuse Free
- 7 Environmental Program, Tempo, Uniondale High
- 8 School, Valley Stream Central High School,
- 9 Wantagh United School District, West
- 10 Hempstead United School District, Westbury
- 11 United Free School District. YES in Oyster
- 12 Bay, and East Norwich, and YES, which would
- 13 also be the one in Massapequa. That's a
- 14 general listing. They have different
- 15 services. They have programs within the
- 16 schools, they have community, they have
- 17 counseling.
- 18 I can give you a more
- 19 comprehensive list at a later time or send
- 20 it to your office.
- 21 LEGISLATOR TROIANO: That was
- 22 actually very helpful. Thank you.
- Then if we can look at 26-13
- 24 which provides \$863,000 for the No Wrong
- 25 Door Family Support System.

- 2 COMMISSIONER MURPHY: Correct.
- 3 That was part the SAMSHA grant which was
- 4 that No Wrong Door, as you said, and that
- 5 works primarily with children at risk and
- 6 their families.
- 7 LEGISLATOR TROIANO: So, I'm
- 8 sorry, where is the money coming from?
- 9 COMMISSIONER MURPHY: It's a
- 10 federal grant. It's SAMSHA.
- 11 LEGISLATOR TROIANO: But we're
- 12 not being asked here, I don't think, to
- 13 accept the federal grant money. It looks
- 14 like we are being asked to switch it from
- 15 one category to another.
- 16 COMMISSIONER MURPHY: No. It's
- 17 part of our grant plan and has been
- 18 previously. It's always been there since we
- 19 started receiving the money. Every year
- 20 this particular grant changes. It's onset
- 21 back in 2009, I believe it was one where we
- 22 were receiving tremendous amounts of money
- 23 from the federal government in excess of
- 24 \$2.5 million a year, but it's one of those
- 25 grants where each year we have to put up a

- 2 bit more and we are now in the last year I
- 3 believe of this particular grant.
- 4 LEGISLATOR TROIANO: And this
- 5 program is administered by the hospital?
- 6 COMMISSIONER MURPHY: It's in
- 7 conjunction with the hospital and it's also
- 8 with family support systems of care. The
- 9 kids come in and out of the hospital. They
- 10 can identify. And they are coordinated
- 11 through the hospital through NUMC with this
- 12 particular community based organization.
- 13 LEGISLATOR TROIANO: How does
- 14 that work, the community based portions, how
- 15 does that work? You have a partner in
- 16 various communities that are distributing
- 17 the services?
- 18 COMMISSIONER MURPHY: This is a
- 19 county wide community-based organization.
- 20 It's really not fair to say that it's
- 21 community based, but it's basically a
- 22 not-for-profit that goes out into the
- 23 community where the children are and works
- 24 with their families there.
- 25 This particular organization was

Health/Social Services 1-7-13 1 2 actually selected when the original grant 3 was won, again, I would say it was in 2009 4 or '08 that the grant was originally 5 accorded to the county. It was a very big 6 media event and that's where we really got the slogan, "no wrong door". The whole idea 7 8 being that the children and the families present either at the hospital or many times 9 10 they're identified through social services. 11 And then they are coordinated with this 12 particular not for profit agency which then 13 works with them and their families in 14 community. LEGISLATOR TROIANO: Do you know 15 16 the name of that agency? 17 COMMISSIONER MURPHY: Yes, it's the Family Resource Center. 18 19 LEGISLATOR TROIANO: Thank you. COMMISSIONER MURPHY: Thank you. 20 21 CHAIRWOMAN WALKER: Any other 22 comments or questions from the legislators? 23 (No verbal response.) 24 Any public comment? 25 (No verbal response.)
