- 6 LEGISLATOR NICOLELLO: Second.
- 7 CHAIRMAN VENDITTO: Motion by
- 8 Legislator Walker, seconded by Legislator
- 9 Nicolello. Mr. Kelly, good to see you.
- 10 MR. KELLY: Thank you. Michael
- 11 Kelly, acting director, Nassau County
- 12 Department of Public Works, Division of Real
- 13 Estate Services.
- 14 Clerk Item 60-13 is a sale of
- 15 real property to Young Ok Ahn Kim and Kwan
- 16 Bae Kim. Purchase price is \$5,500. The
- 17 property is Section 5, Block 161, Lot 60
- 18 located in Port Washington.
- 19 The appraisal for this property
- 20 came in at \$3,500. This property was heard
- 21 at public hearing March 15th, 2012, and
- 22 OSPAC and planning made recommendations on
- 23 April 4th and April 5th, 2012 respectively,
- 24 and we are requesting that this legislature
- 25 designate this as an unlisted action and

- 2 issue a negative declaration and
- 3 determination of non-significance.
- 4 CHAIRMAN VENDITTO: Any questions
- 5 on this item? Legislator Denenberg.
- 6 LEGISLATOR DENENBERG: Was there
- 7 any opposition at OSPAC or at the planning
- 8 commission?
- 9 MR. KELLY: There was no
- 10 opposition at the public hearing. It was
- 11 requested that this property not be
- 12 transferred to a certain major developer
- 13 that was next door to the property. It was
- 14 offered to that developer per our standard
- 15 procedures but they did not bid on the
- 16 property.
- 17 LEGISLATOR DENENBERG: So there
- 18 was no opposition to the purchase by this
- 19 particular purchaser?
- MR. KELLY: No, not at all.
- 21 LEGISLATOR DENENBERG: Any
- 22 restriction on subdivisions?
- 23 MR. KELLY: The planning
- 24 commission recommended a restriction on
- 25 subdivision but that came out of the

- 2 previous concern about selling the property
- 3 to that major development that was there,
- 4 but since we are selling it to an individual
- 5 property owner there is no restriction on
- 6 it.
- 7 LEGISLATOR DENENBERG: Is this
- 8 going to enable this property owner to make
- 9 a subdivision?
- 10 MR. KELLY: No. The planning
- 11 commission resolution, the acquisition to
- 12 the property by an adjacent owner cannot
- 13 result in a single lot that can be
- 14 subdivided for residential development as of
- 15 right.
- 16 LEGISLATOR DENENBERG: Thank you.
- MR. KELLY: You're welcome.
- 18 LEGISLATOR NICOLELLO: I have a
- 19 question.
- 20 CHAIRMAN VENDITTO: Legislator
- 21 Nicolello.
- 22 LEGISLATOR NICOLELLO: Mr. Kelly,
- 23 is it possible for the owner, the new owner
- 24 of that property to then sell it to the
- 25 development next door?

- 2 MR. KELLY: They could. But that
- 3 was -- the planning commission already made
- 4 the determination that it can't be
- 5 subdivided as of right, so -- but they could
- 6 sell it.
- 7 CHAIRMAN VENDITTO: Thank you.
- 8 Just as a reminder, we have now three clerk
- 9 items before the committee. Are there any
- 10 other questions or any discussion from any
- 11 of the legislators on any these three
- 12 remaining items?
- 13 (No verbal response.)
- 14 If it's all right, if you will
- 15 allow me, we will do the votes one at a time
- 16 since there are only three items.
- So Clerk Item Number 60-13, all
- 18 those in favor of passing this item signify
- 19 by saying aye.
- 20 (Aye.)
- 21 Any opposed?
- (No verbal response.)
- The item passes unanimously.
- 24 Clerk Item Number 61-13, all
- 25 those in favor of passing this item signify

- 2 by saying aye.
- 3 (Aye.)
- 4 Any opposed?
- 5 (No verbal response.)
- The item passes unanimously.
- 7 Finally Clerk Item Number 62-13,
- 8 all those in favor of passing this item
- 9 signify by saying aye.
- 10 (Aye.)
- 11 Any opposed?
- 12 (No verbal response.)
- 13 This item passes unanimously as
- 14 well. I know it's not customary, members of
- 15 the committee, for us to have this
- 16 situation, but a resident from Long Beach
- 17 has some concerns that she would like to
- 18 share with this committee.
- 19 As long as there are no
- 20 objections, I would like to ask her to come
- 21 forward for the next few minutes and just
- 22 speak with us.
- Julie, are you here? Just state
- 24 your name and address for the record one
- 25 more time. How are you, Julie?

- MS. SEGHROUCHNI: Sure. I'm very
- 3 well. Thank you. Thank you everyone for
- 4 allowing me to speak.
- 5 My name is Julie Seghrouchni and
- 6 I'm a horticulture educator and a forestry
- 7 educator for Cornell Cooperative Extension.
- 8 I am a resident of Long Beach, so I did deal
- 9 with many of the ramifications of Sandy. My
- 10 home address is 134 Cleveland Avenue, Long
- 11 Beach, New York.
- 12 Basically I'm here to speak
- 13 about, I should pass it out, this is an
- 14 ordinance that was --
- 15 CHAIRMAN VENDITTO: The
- 16 documents, please distribute them.
- MS. SEGHROUCHNI: In 2008, Nassau
- 18 County passed a tree ordinance which was a
- 19 wonderful thing because it really showed the
- 20 environmental mindset of Nassau County that
- 21 you want to pursue to think about the future
- 22 of the environment.
- 23 Within this ordinance, there was
- 24 a recommendation for a Nassau County Tree
- 25 Advisory Committee, which, unfortunately, in

- 2 the past hearing, did not pass because I
- 3 believe there was just not enough
- 4 information about specifically what the
- 5 advisory committee would do.
- In the ordinance, there's
- 7 specific roles, five recommendations. One
- 8 is for the department of public works for
- 9 one of the representatives to be, that would
- 10 be Rich Arnados who is a designee. The
- 11 commissioner of parks, Mr. Foskey, a
- 12 representative of LIPA, Larry Fernandez,
- 13 because he is a utility arborist specialist,
- 14 myself, an educator from Cornell, and also
- 15 an educator from another nonprofit
- 16 organization from relief who could work on a
- 17 lot of the youth education in arbor culture.
- The main purpose of this
- 19 committee is to educate and include this in
- 20 Nassau County mailings, on the Nassau County
- 21 website, on which trees are more wind
- 22 resistant, how to prune trees to be wind
- 23 resistant, and how to take this opportunity
- 24 where we have lost so many trees, to do it
- 25 right.

- I mean, most of the trees that
- 3 fell, actually initially they fell during
- 4 Irene because they were so battered. It's
- 5 just amazing how resilient trees are. They
- 6 were hit by weed whackers, roots were
- 7 completely broken during construction,
- 8 incorrect pesticides, incorrect irrigation.
- 9 We really have to make a tremendous change,
- 10 not just the planting and the choosing but
- 11 in the ongoing maintenance. When that's
- 12 done, in the long run, you do save a lot of
- 13 money. You don't have to go and have
- 14 emergencies and take down thousands of
- 15 trees.
- 16 Hurricane Sandy was a little
- 17 different. It had very sustained winds. It
- 18 came from all different directions.
- 19 Hopefully we won't have that type of thing
- 20 again. That, unfortunately, we did lose
- 21 some healthy trees. But that's part of the
- 22 program. When you plant your trees, and you
- 23 look at where you're planting them, you want
- 24 to make sure they have room. You want to
- 25 try to plant trees that are larger obviously

- 2 in parks where they there are -- you don't
- 3 want to have them near targets where they
- 4 can fall on homes.
- 5 But the biggest thing is choosing
- 6 the right tree and planting correctly. We
- 7 have a lot of research that the USGA gave
- 8 Syracuse University \$130,000 for research.
- 9 It doesn't make sense to let to let this
- 10 research go to waste. Cornell University
- 11 has a complete urban institute. All the
- 12 information is available.
- 13 What we need to do is to really
- 14 begin to apply that research. Now is the
- 15 time to do it, to be the visionaries. You
- 16 may might not be able to see the product of
- 17 what you started, but this can really save
- 18 Nassau County.
- 19 The green-scape of Nassau County
- 20 has been so diminished, and, unfortunately,
- 21 I think that people have forgotten the value
- 22 of trees. In addition to obviously oxygen,
- 23 big thing is a reduction in crime, cleaning
- 24 the air, cleaning the water. We have so
- 25 many problems with our waterways, with storm

- 2 water, with erosion, just making people feel
- 3 better. It's healthier. After emergency
- 4 crises, there have been so much research
- 5 showing that being in a green environment
- 6 helps people.
- 7 This is not a speech to try to
- 8 push hugging trees and to be overly
- 9 environmental, just to balance. We really
- 10 have to find the balance. People and trees,
- 11 it's one ecology, and basically we need each
- 12 other.
- So what I'm hoping is that at the
- 14 next meeting, on February 25th, if I can
- 15 meet with some of you and go over some of
- 16 these specific duties of each person in the
- 17 commission. We could hopefully get it
- 18 passed by the next legislative meeting.
- 19 CHAIRMAN VENDITTO: Julie, thank
- 20 you so much for coming down today and
- 21 raising this issue that clearly is a lot on
- 22 our minds and will be going forward.
- 23 I think, Legislator Ford, you
- 24 wanted to address Julie?
- 25 LEGISLATOR FORD: Julie, I do

- 2 want to thank you very much for coming down.
- 3 I know that we met a while back up at City
- 4 Hall in Long Beach talking about the trees
- 5 and hoping to at that time to make Long
- 6 Beach tree city designation.
- 7 MS. SEGHROUCHNI: Yes. And I'm
- 8 still going to push it.
- 9 LEGISLATOR FORD: And I think you
- 10 should. And I also believe that you bring
- 11 up some very interesting ideas in regard --
- 12 because we're going to have to re-plant a
- 13 lot, especially in the areas that were
- 14 severely impacted by Sandy. You know,
- 15 whether or not the trees were blown over, or
- 16 torn down or uprooted, we are also going to
- 17 find that a lot of our trees and shrubs are
- 18 dying and are not going to come back.
- MS. SEGHROUCHNI: Right.
- 20 LEGISLATOR FORD: And I actually
- 21 paid attention to you at that meeting way
- 22 back when and I do believe, with our
- 23 arborists, those who truly know and study
- 24 trees, and how important it is to not only
- 25 pick out the right type of tree for a

- 2 certain environment, but to make sure that
- 3 you don't use all the same tree in a
- 4 community that you do diversify and also how
- 5 important the planting is, whether or not
- 6 the depth, for when you do plant.
- 7 So I would be happy to meet with
- 8 you before that meeting because I would like
- 9 to hear more of what you have to say.
- MS. SEGHROUCHNI: Thank you.
- 11 LEGISLATOR FORD: And I think
- 12 that if we all work together that maybe we
- 13 have an opportunity of doing something
- 14 different with some of the trees because
- 15 I've known over the years some of them have
- 16 died not because of disasters but just
- 17 because they weren't properly taken care or
- 18 planted properly. So I think if we have an
- 19 opportunity now of doing it right, let's do
- 20 it.
- MS. SEGHROUCHNI: Thank you.
- 22 Yes. We will be in touch. I appreciate you
- 23 remember the importance of diversity.
- 24 CHAIRMAN VENDITTO: Legislator
- 25 Denenberg.

- 2 LEGISLATOR DENENBERG: Just
- 3 quickly, Julie, thanks. When this was
- 4 passed in '08 on bipartisan lines at that
- 5 time, the whole idea of this committee is
- 6 not necessarily to be planting trees all
- 7 over. Being a tree city is plant the trees,
- 8 where the right tree is for the right
- 9 location. No trees in the wrong location.
- 10 So that we can save a lot of the trees that
- 11 came down in storms or just over time. I
- 12 don't know if anything would have helped
- 13 under Sandy, but --
- MS. SEGHROUCHNI: It would have
- 15 helped if things were better. You still
- 16 would have lost good trees, but it would
- 17 have helped.
- 18 LEGISLATOR DENENBERG: But the
- 19 part of this and part of the goal always was
- 20 to plan how we re-plant or how we plant. So
- 21 it's not just a matter of putting up as
- 22 matter trees in as many locations, it's
- 23 being smart, the right tree for the right
- 24 location.
- 25 MS. SEGHROUCHNI: Thank you. I

- 2 would much rather have fewer trees done
- 3 correctly than more trees done incorrectly.
- 4 And you are absolutely right, a goal of --
- 5 once you have a committee, then you can move
- 6 towards becoming what's called a tree city.
- 7 Which is Nassau County would be the first
- 8 county to be a tree city, so that would be a
- 9 nice thing to be able to say about the
- 10 county.
- 11 CHAIRMAN VENDITTO: Very much so.
- 12 Legislator Jacobs.
- 13 LEGISLATOR JACOBS: Hi. I just
- 14 want to ask you one fast question.
- 15 You mentioned certain names on
- 16 the committee, which is great, has the
- 17 committee met since this was passed?
- MS. SEGHROUCHNI: No. The
- 19 ordinance specifically said a representative
- 20 from DPW/parks, so that's how the committee
- 21 was formed. A representative from two
- 22 non-profits, and --
- 23 LEGISLATOR JACOBS: I'm trying to
- 24 remember because I believe I was presiding
- 25 officer at the time. I'm trying to

- 2 understand why this was never put into place
- 3 as a committee.
- 4 MS. SEGHROUCHNI: I would like to
- 5 understand that too.
- 6 LEGISLATOR JACOBS: I believe it
- 7 passed though. I'm trying to think back.
- MS. SEGHROUCHNI: It did pass but
- 9 the committee was never formed. So that's
- 10 kind of the goal.
- 11 LEGISLATOR JACOBS: So that's
- 12 really something that we don't have to
- 13 reintroduce as much as make it happen. All
- 14 right. Because Dave and I were trying to
- 15 figure out why didn't it go anywhere. But I
- 16 imagine it might be an executive order to
- 17 establish the committee. It's a good idea
- 18 especially now, we've learned an awful lot.
- MS. SEGHROUCHNI: So hopefully we
- 20 can meet and maybe get on the agenda for
- 21 February 25th and then we can get moving.
- 22 CHAIRMAN VENDITTO: Well, the
- 23 bottom line here is, and thank you,
- 24 Legislator Jacobs, I think it's a very good
- 25 thing that the lines of communication as to
