The Long Island based 501 (C) (3) not-for-profit organization Kids Helping Kids by Kids Way, Inc. has launched the 2012 Ninth Annual **"Making a Warmth of Difference"** winter apparel drive. We have received well-over 6000 plus units of donated "new only" branded coats and winter related apparel. Although many other agencies donate used clothing, which we know there is a great need for and is greatly appreciated, we felt that kids deserve "new" clothing and have geared our program in this direction. All apparel received is 100% distributed to needy families and their children throughout Long Island and the surrounding areas (photos above are from 2011- 2012 donation recipients). We have distributed "new" coats, fleece, sweaters, hats, gloves, pajamas or other winter related apparel for infant/toddlers, boys/girls and young men's/juniors. This keeps a child and their family hearts and bodies warm for the upcoming cold winter months. We call the program "Making a Warmth of Difference" because a child is receiving a gift of warmth for the holiday season and cold winter months upon us. Our not-for-profit slogan "Making a World of Difference" says it all; as a family in need, with limited or no income, now won't have to pay hundreds of dollars for a new winter coat or related apparel for their child.

Kids Way Inc. Executive Director Bob Eslick said "many Long Island families are facing very tough economic times, especially since Hurricane Sandy, and this apparel will most certainly come in handy during the cold winter months upon us." This program focuses on obtaining new only winter apparel rather than used, to give children and families in need something special. "A lot of kids today, especially those that live in economically challenged areas, don't often get new things," Mr. Eslick said and "this is their opportunity". We will deliver in excess of \$400,000 (MSRP) in winter related apparel in 2012 via the "Making a Warmth of Difference" winter apparel program and to date since the inception of the program over \$1.4 million dollars in donated new only branded apparel has been delivered by the Kids Helping Kids by Kids Way Inc. organization to Long Island kids and families most in need.

Kids Helping Kids by Kids Way Inc. has worked very closely with several Nassau County agencies in need of this apparel so those most in need will benefit. Some of the agencies that have benefited from these donations include the Education & Assistance Corporation, The Salvation Army, The Mary Brennan INN in Hempstead, Circulo de la Hispanidad, Family & Children's Association, C.A.S.A (Coordinated Agency for Spanish Americans) among others. Another past and current recipient of apparel from this program is Nassau County Social Services. The Department of Social Services Commissioner, Dr. John Imhof. Commissioner Imhof noted that since its inception the KHK organization and the "Making a Warmth of Difference" program has collected and donated thousands of "new" coats, fleece and other winter related apparel to Nassau County. In addition Commissioner Imhof said that "Kids Helping Kids is an outstanding role model showing how youngsters reach out and care about kids less fortunate than themselves, especially in times of need".
