WHAT IS THE MEDICAL RESERVE CORPS?

In 2002, the Medical Reserve Corps (MRC) program was formed as a national network of local groups of volunteers committed to improving the public health, emergency response, and resiliency of their respective communities. The Office of the Surgeon General (OSG) leads the MRC program to provide the structure necessary to deploy medical and public health personnel in response to an emergency as it identifies specific, trained, credentialed personnel available and ready to respond to emergencies.

The MRC is a partner program with Citizen Corps, a national network of volunteers dedicated to ensuring hometown security. Other Citizen Corps programs include Community Emergency Response Teams (CERT), Fire Corps, Neighborhood Watch, and Volunteers in Police Service (VIPS). Citizen Corps is part of the USA Freedom Corps, which promotes volunteerism and service nationwide. Other USA Freedom Corps programs include Peace Corps, AmeriCorps, and Senior Corps.

WHO CAN APPLY?

Students in health professions, practicing, and retired medical and health care professionals such as physicians, nurses, pharmacists, physician assistants, dentists, emergency medical technicians, mental health professionals, veterinarians, and others can apply.

How do I apply?

- 1. You may download a copy of the Nassau County MRC Application at the Nassau County Department of Health website. You may also send an email or call to receive an application by mail.
- 2. Complete an application and return with a copy of your driver's license to:

- 3. Upon receipt, the application will be forwarded to the Nassau County Police Department (NCPD) for a background investigation.
- 4. Upon approval, a representative from the Nassau County Department of Health will contact you.

The time for volunteers to become involved in emergency response is **NOW** – *BEFORE* an incident occurs.
