- 3 CLERK MULLER: We have a quorum.
- 4 CHAIRWOMAN WALKER: Thank you.
- 5 There are five items on the agenda today.
- 6 The first is Clerk Item 701-12 which is an
- 7 ordinance supplemental to the annual
- 8 appropriation ordinance in connection with
- 9 the Department of Social Services. Do I
- 10 have a motion, please?
- 11 LEGISLATOR BECKER: So moved.
- 12 LEGISLATOR VENDITTO: Second.
- 13 CHAIRWOMAN WALKER: Moved by
- 14 Legislator Becker, seconded by Legislator
- 15 Venditto. The item is before us. Mr. May.
- 16 MR. MAY: Madam Chairwoman, can
- 17 we also call Item 710-12?
- CHAIRWOMAN WALKER: 710 or 709?
- MR. MAY: I have 710 with Mr.
- 20 Paul Broderick of Social Services. Are my
- 21 numbers incorrect?
- 22 CHAIRWOMAN WALKER: Your number
- 23 is right and my number is wrong. Clerk Item
- 24 710-12 which is an ordinance supplemental to
- 25 the annual appropriation ordinance in

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- 2 connection with the Department of Social
- 3 Services. Can I have a motion on that also,
- 4 please?
- 5 LEGISLATOR BECKER: So moved.
- 6 LEGISLATOR VENDITTO: Second.
- 7 CHAIRWOMAN WALKER: Moved by
- 8 Legislator Becker, seconded by Legislator
- 9 Venditto.
- 10 MR. MAY: We have Mr. Paul
- 11 Broderick.
- MR. BRODERICK: Legislators, good
- 13 afternoon. Paul Broderick, deputy
- 14 commissioner, Department of Social Services.
- 15 Item 701-12 is a supplemental
- 16 appropriation for \$12.9 million. The funds
- 17 here are 100 percent federal and state funds
- 18 which goes towards personal costs associated
- 19 with food stamps, HEAP, employment and Child
- 20 Protective Services. Do you have any
- 21 questions?
- 22 CHAIRWOMAN WALKER: Any questions
- 23 for Mr. Broderick?
- 24 (No verbal response.)
- 25 Any public comment?

3	We'll vote on them together. So
4	now Item 710.
5	MR. BRODERICK: Item 710 is a
6	supplemental appropriation for \$150,000 that
7	will be essentially given to the Nassau
8	County Coalition Against Domestic Violence
9	for them to provide essential services and
10	expand upon the services they provide, To
11	hire two police project advocates and to
12	expand their attorney or to fund a part time
13	attorney for their organization to advocate
14	on behalf of victims of domestic violence.
15	Do you have any questions?
16	CHAIRWOMAN WALKER: Any
17	questions?
18	(No verbal response.)
19	Any public comment?
20	(No verbal response.)
21	We have Clerk Item 701 and 710.
22	All those in favor signify by saying aye.
23	(Aye.)
24	Any opposed?
25	(No verbal response.)

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- The item is unanimous.
- MR. BRODERICK: Thank you.
- 4 CHAIRWOMAN WALKER: And, Mr.
- 5 Broderick, just while you're there, it gives
- 6 me the opportunity to thank you and
- 7 Commissioner Imhoff and certainly all your
- 8 staff for the amazing job you've been doing
- 9 during the storm. I know we still have
- 10 shelters that are open and it's been a
- 11 difficult time for everybody, but you've all
- 12 worked very very hard and I know I speak for
- 13 all of us here and, you know, members of
- 14 your department who have lost everything
- 15 too, yet they're still out there working
- 16 hard and doing all they can to help others.
- 17 So I just want to thank you on behalf of all
- 18 of us.
- MR. BRODERICK: Legislator
- 20 Walker, I appreciate that, but seeing what
- 21 I've seen and the number of hours, there
- 22 definitely has been teamwork from not only a
- 23 number of other departments within the
- 24 county, but also state and federal partners.
- 25 It's been quite a learning experience and,

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- 2 you know, personally and professionally it
- 3 does have an impact on your life.
- 4 But it was nice just to see that
- 5 people were working together for a common
- 6 cause and achieving a goal. But thank you
- 7 very much for acknowledging that.
- 8 CHAIRWOMAN WALKER: Thank you.
- 9 Clerk Item 706 is an ordinance supplemental
- 10 to the annual appropriation ordinance in
- 11 connection with the Health department.
- We also have Clerk Item 707 which
- is an ordinance supplemental to the annual
- 14 appropriation ordinance in connection with
- 15 the Health department.
- 16 Clerk Item 708 is an ordinance
- 17 supplemental to the annual appropriation
- 18 ordinance in connection with the Health
- 19 department. We'll take them all together.
- LEGISLATOR BECKER: So moved.
- 21 LEGISLATOR VENDITTO: Second.
- 22 CHAIRWOMAN WALKER: There was a
- 23 motion by Legislator Becker, seconded by
- 24 Legislator Venditto.
- 25 MR. MAY: We have Ms. Mary Ellen

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- 2 Lorraine from Health.
- MS. LORRAINE: Good afternoon.
- 4 Mary Ellen Lorraine, Department of Health.
- 5 Item 706 is a supplemental appropriation in
- 6 the amount of \$79,167. This is for the
- 7 sexually transmitted disease program funded
- 8 through New York State Department of Health.
- 9 It confirms the treatment of infection and
- 10 assures that those affected are being
- 11 treated, including partners.
- 12 CHAIRWOMAN WALKER: Any questions
- 13 from the legislators?
- 14 (No verbal response.)
- Any public comment?
- 16 (No verbal response.)
- 17 The next item was 707.
- MS. LORRAINE: Item 707 is a
- 19 supplemental appropriation in the amount of
- 20 \$751,836. This is for the early
- 21 intervention program. It is funded through
- 22 New York State Department of Health and New
- 23 York State Social Services. It covers the
- 24 administrative costs to the program for
- 25 those children zero to three who are at risk

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- 2 for development delay.
- 3 CHAIRWOMAN WALKER: Any questions
- 4 from the legislators?
- 5 (No verbal response.)
- Any public comment?
- 7 (No verbal response.)
- Now Clerk Item 708.
- 9 MS. LORRAINE: Item 708 is a
- 10 supplemental appropriation for the bathing
- 11 beach water quality monitoring program. It
- 12 is for \$42,250. It is funded through New
- 13 York State Department of Health and is
- 14 mandated per the New York State Sanitary
- 15 Code.
- 16 CHAIRWOMAN WALKER: Any questions
- 17 from the legislators?
- 18 (No verbal response.)
- 19 Any public comment?
- 20 (No verbal response.)
- 21 All those in favor of Clerk Items
- 22 706, 707, and 708 signify by saying aye.
- 23 (Aye.)
- 24 Any opposed?
- 25 (No verbal response.)

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- The motions carry unanimously.
- 3 And just before you walk away from the
- 4 podium, too, Mary Ellen, that same thank you
- 5 goes to you and to all your department. I
- 6 know, as Mr. Broderick said, we've all been
