7	okay. Now, this money from the Department
8	of Health to enhance the public water supply
9	in Nassau County, we use this money for the
10	underground injection wells to take sampling
11	and test it. What are we doing?
12	MS. LORRAINE: The public water
13	districts do the sampling. We conduct
14	surveillance samples and we also assure that
15	those wells that may have been contaminated
16	when it reaches that all of the steps are
17	being followed to protect the water supply.
18	LEGISLATOR DENENBERG: Because
19	there was recently news about a public well
20	that had been from the Grumman property
21	going down gradient had been impacted and
22	that was something that the DEC was
23	requiring Aqua Water to do a clean up. They
24	were getting back federal funds. When I

25 inquired, I didn't understand why Nassau

- 3 made studies on that because I thought all
- 4 the water samples go through us when it
- 5 comes to drinking water.
- 6 MS. LORRAINE: It may be -- the
- 7 DEC may have taken the lead on that. I
- 8 would have to have one of our engineers in
- 9 the water department call you directly on
- 10 that. I can arrange for that.
- 11 LEGISLATOR DENENBERG: And the
- 12 environmental lab, the lab that does the
- 13 water testing is still open?
- 14 MS. LORRAINE: That's correct.
- 15 LEGISLATOR DENENBERG: It's
- 16 separate than the clinical lab, correct?
- MS. LORRAINE: Correct.
- 18 LEGISLATOR DENENBERG: And there
- 19 is no litigation involving the environmental
- 20 lab, correct?
- 21 MS. LORRAINE: There is pending
- 22 litigation regarding the laboratory itself.
- 23 LEGISLATOR DENENBERG: Including
- 24 both the environmental and --
- MS. LORRAINE: The environmental

 and clinical lab are under one laboratory

 called the public health laboratory.

 LEGISLATOR DENENBERG: So the

 environmental lab aspect is still open,
- 6 correct?
- 7 MS. LORRAINE: That's correct.
- 8 LEGISLATOR DENENBERG: The
- 9 clinical lab aspect is the one that's not?
- 10 MS. LORRAINE: I really can't
- 11 comment on that due to the litigation.
- 12 LEGISLATOR DENENBERG: You can't
- 13 comment on whether it's open or not?
- 14 MS. LORRAINE: I would have to
- 15 defer to the county attorney on that.
- 16 LEGISLATOR DENENBERG: Because?
- 17 MS. LORRAINE: Of the pending
- 18 litigation.
- 19 LEGISLATOR DENENBERG: I'm just
- 20 asking whether the clinical lab is open.
- MS. LORRAINE: Right now the
- 22 clinical lab is not accepting samples.

3	LEGISLATOR DENENBERG: I guess
4	the reason why I was asking is that my
5	concern is, I thought I got information that
6	the state had just closed the clinical lab
7	or closed it from accepting samples. I
8	don't know if that's true or not, I don't
9	know how it impacts, if at all, the
10	environmental lab.
11	MS. LORRAINE: I would have to
12	really defer to the county attorney due to
13	pending litigation.
14	LEGISLATOR DENENBERG: Really? I
15	think this is a matter of public importance
16	but you're telling me the environmental lab
17	is still accepting samples?
18	MS. LORRAINE: That's correct.
19	LEGISLATOR DENENBERG: And I
20	should speak to the county attorney
21	regarding the clinical lab?
22	MS. LORRAINE: I would the
23	appropriation before us, none of the funds
24	for this appropriation are paid for to the

25 laboratory. So I'm speaking on this

- 2 appropriation. So as far as any other
- 3 questions outside of this, I really would
- 4 have to --
- 5 LEGISLATOR DENENBERG: I thought
- 6 it was paid for, the laboratory work?
- 7 MS. LORRAINE: No. This
- 8 appropriation pays for approximately one and
- 9 a half public health sanitarians. This
- 10 money is not used for our laboratory.
- 11 LEGISLATOR DENENBERG: So it was
- 12 for evaluations of VOC removal systems --
- MS. LORRAINE: That's correct,
- 14 but the monies are not used -- the monies
- 15 are used to pay one and a half public health
- 16 sanitarians to conduct sampling.
- 17 LEGISLATOR DENENBERG: Okay.
- 18 I'll disagree with you there but I'm going
- 19 to let it go because we should say yes, but
- 20 to conduct sampling, sampling means testing.
- 21 All right.
- I'm going to let it go but I
- 23 would ask the chair that, given that it's a
- 24 finance issue, and we're hearing about the
- 25 clinical lab, I would ask that perhaps we

- 2 should look into what is going on with the
- 3 clinical lab if we can only hear about that
- 4 through the county attorney because of
- 5 litigation, and I'm hearing that half of our
- 6 lab, our public health lab is not accepting
- 7 samples.
- 8 CHAIRMAN NICOLELLO: Ms. Lorraine
- 9 has made it clear that it has no relevance
- 10 to this issue that's before us, number one.
- 11 Number two, I agree that --
- 12 LEGISLATOR DENENBERG: It has
- 13 relevance to state funding.
- 14 CHAIRMAN NICOLELLO: We should at
- 15 the appropriate time have hearings either
- 16 before the full legislature or the public
- 17 safety committee on the issue, but as far as
- 18 finance, I think we have to focus on what is
- 19 before us.
- 20 LEGISLATOR DENENBERG: I was just
- 21 wondering that if our clinical lab isn't
- 22 taking samples any more that we're going --
- 23 that state funding would the jeopardized.
- 24 CHAIRMAN NICOLELLO: Obviously
- 25 this state funding isn't because it's here

- 2 before us. And one of the other things,
- 3 there is numerous committees and there's a
- 4 lot of overlap, obviously things have
- 5 financial implications and things have
- 6 public works, public health, public safety
- 7 implications, so we are not really looking
- 8 to do redundant hearings. If we need to do
- 9 hearings on that subject, we will focus on
- 10 what we -- the committees or full
- 11 legislature so that all legislators have an
- 12 opportunity to speak on it.
- 13 LEGISLATOR DENENBERG: We haven't
- 14 done any near as I can tell with respect to
- 15 the public health lab, clinical or
- 16 environmental.
- 17 CHAIRMAN NICOLELLO: Well,
- 18 obviously, given what we know about it and
- 19 given the lawsuits, I don't know if that
- 20 hearing would be in the best interest of
- 21 this county at this time, and I think
- 22 witnesses speaking on it would simply become
- 23 testimony that will become part of the
- 24 lawsuits against the county. That's another
- 25 subject. So can we just focus on what's
