- 10 Community College. The item in front of you
- 11 is in association with the Energy Services
- 12 Agreement that was signed by the county and
- 13 the college in 2005, and all it does is
- 14 allocate back to the college 20 percent of
- 15 the lease payments from the -- what was
- 16 Trigen (phonetic) at the time, now is Suez
- 17 Plant owned by the county and operated by
- 18 that company that provides heating and
- 19 cooling to Nassau Community College as well
- 20 as several other operations in the hub area.
- 21 CHAIRMAN KOPEL: Has this been
- 22 done historically the same way?
- 23 MR MUSCARELLA: Ever since 2005.
- 24 CHAIRMAN KOPEL: Ever since 2005,
- 25 okay. Any questions? Legislator Denenberg.

- 2 LEGISLATOR DENENBERG: We get the
- 3 money and we allocate it to the college or
- 4 the college gets the money and then
- 5 allocates it to us?
- 6 MR MUSCARELLA: The payment goes
- 7 from now Suez to the county and then 20
- 8 percent of their payment in the order of
- 9 about \$200,000 comes back to the college.
- 10 The reason why it was done that way was that
- 11 when we receive, the college receives a
- 12 lease payment from a third party that is not
- 13 county operating funds, we can take that to
- 14 the state and get matching funds for it. We
- 15 have done that to the tune of half a million
- 16 dollars so far.
- 17 LEGISLATOR DENENBERG: So this is
- 18 a lease payment that goes in part to the
- 19 county and in part to the college because
- they're using county and college property?
- 21 MR MUSCARELLA: It was on Nassau
- 22 Community College property when it was built
- 23 but the lease payment goes to the county.
- 24 LEGISLATOR DENENBERG: Okay. All
- 25 right.
