We received this grant, in addition to other counties that are in proximity to New York City, such as Westchester, Yonkers, in fact Suffolk because it is part of Long Island, and

Port Authority is part of this too, in addition to New York City.

We get a small share of the award; in this case it's \$2,584,000 and that is the exact same amount that Yonkers, Suffolk, and Westchester receive. It's split pretty equally.

The objective with this grant is that we are to assist some of the other departments within the county which have homeland security terrorism interests; in this case, the Health Department, PD, and Fire Commission fall into that.

the local townships, can they also get a portion

MR. DELANEY: We have definitely been helping our communities within Nassau County with these grants. Our fire service, in particular,
