As far as the active duty leisure pass, the language that we're looking at is to make the active duty military ID that our service men and women have, that that would automatically count as a leisure passport. That they would not have to pay a fee or get a separate ID. They would go ahead and use their active duty military ID.

CHAIRMAN MACKENZIE: Tell the county executive thank you on behalf of --

But my point is that veterans are very proud to have a card that says veterans. So many people already do have that card that says veterans.

Just a separate card for the active military duty, that when they're finished serving they can then get a veterans one.

MR. MAY: Yes. We agree. It wouldn't be in place of a veteran's passport. It would be probably a separate line on the ordinance where it would say active duty military personnel can show their ID, no matter what branch of the military they're from, and that would be, for all intents and purposes, be a leisure passport.

Obviously, we have active duty military stationed in Nassau County from all over the country. It's just a benefit to our active duty military personnel.
