3	Legislator Kevan Abrahams?
4	LEGISLATOR ABRAHAMS: Here.
5	CHAIRMAN DUNNE: Legislator Dave
6	Denenberg?

8	CHAIRMAN DUNNE: Legislator Laura
9	Curran, Ranking Member?
10	LEGISLATOR CURRAN: Here.
11	CHAIRMAN DUNNE: Legislator Denise Ford?
12	LEGISLATOR FORD: Here.
13	CHAIRMAN DUNNE: Legislator Vincent
14	Muscarella?
15	LEGISLATOR MUSCARELLA: Here.
16	CHAIRMAN DUNNE: Legislator Donald
17	MacKenzie, Vice Chairman?
18	LEGISLATOR MACKENZIE: Here.
19	CHAIRMAN DUNNE: And I'm here. We have
20	a quorum.
21	Just before we start I want to make two
22	quick announcements. One, the tour of the jail,
23	we're still trying to get a date for that. I
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2	spoke with the sheriff and he's going to set
3	something up for us, and we're going to get a
4	nice tour of the jail. So that's in the works.
5	The other thing we asked for at the last
6	meeting was a demonstration about the triangular
7	shots fired cameras. We're going to be working
8	on that. We will have a date in the very near
9	future. And it's going to be in Westbury so we
10	can see the cameras, shots fired. That thing we
11	passed at our last meeting. So those two things
12	are in the works. As soon as we hear, the
13	members I think all legislators will be
14	notified in case anybody else wants to go. You
15	don't have to be on our committee to participate.
16	That being said
17	LEGISLATOR DENENBERG: I just want the
18	record to reflect that I'm here.
19	CHAIRMAN DUNNE: Okay. Legislator
20	Denenberg is here. We have a full complement of
21	the committee members for the Public Safety
22	Committee.
23	First item coming before us is Item 82-
24	14, an ordinance supplemental to the annual
25	appropriation ordinance in connection with the
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2	District Attorney's Office.	
3	MR. MCMANUS: Bob McManus, District	
4	Attorney's Office.	
5	The item before you is a supplemental	
6	appropriation for the sexual assault nurse	
7	examiner program. This program represent a	
8	collaboration between the special victims squad	
9	of the Nassau County Police Department, North	
10	Shore Long Island Jewish Health Systems, the	
11	Sexual Assault Center of the Safe Center, which	
12	is formerly the Nassau County Coalition Against	
13	Domestic Violence, and the District Attorney's	
14	Office.	
15	The same center is a special unit in the	
16	emergency department of North Shore University	
17	Hospital where specially trained nurses	
18	administer treatment to sexual assault victims	
19	using methods specifically designed to preserve	
20	evidence while treating victims with dignity and	
21	compassion in an area that's separate from the	
22	regular emergency area.	
23	CHAIRMAN DUNNE: For the record,	
24	Legislator Denise Ford made the motion, seconded	
25	by Legislator Don MacKenzie.	

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2	Are there any questions on this item?
3	(No verbal response.)
4	Any public comment?
5	(No verbal response.)
6	There being none; all in favor indicate
7	by saying aye.
8	(Aye.)
9	Any against?
10	(No verbal response.)
11	So passed. It goes now to Finance.
12	The next item is Item 87-14, an ordinance
13	supplemental to the annual appropriation
14	ordinance in connection with the police
15	department.
16	Motion by Don MacKenzie, seconded by
17	Denise Ford.
18	Who do we have?
19	SERGEANT STEPHANOFF: Good afternoon.
20	Sergeant Greg Stephanoff.
21	This is a homeland security grant for
22	\$50,000. We're going to use this money to
23	purchase hard license plate readers. It's going
24	to be a system that's going to be pole mounted in
25	an area, an area determined that needs

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2	surveillance so that we can monitor who is coming
3	or going.
4	CHAIRMAN DUNNE: Excellent. Excellent.
5	Joe Belesi and I went to the jail and did
6	a tour many years ago, and we asked if they would
7	put one of those plate readers there because you
8	never know who is going to go visit their buddy
9	in jail, might be a criminal, terrorist or
10	whatever, we don't know. They didn't have the
11	wherefore to do it at that time. Could we see
12	that one of those plate readers goes to the jail?
13	SERGEANT STEPHANOFF: Yeah. I'll make
14	an inquiry in our homeland security section.
15	CHAIRMAN DUNNE: Excellent. Excellent.
16	SERGEANT STEPHANOFF: I think this
17	purchase is purchased as a system that goes to a
18	certain location. I think they have a location
19	in mind. I don't think it's separate cameras
20	that could go anywhere. I believe this is, like,
21	one system. I'll make an inquiry of homeland
22	security.
23	CHAIRMAN DUNNE: Any other questions
24	from any other legislator? Legislator Ford.
25	LEGISLATOR FORD: Considering the fact
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2	that police cars already have this technology in
3	them, is this something that these locations will
4	be known to the public or is it something that
5	you prefer to keep, you know, private?
6	SERGEANT STEPHANOFF: Before I came I
7	did call our homeland security section. They
8	prefer to keep the location I believe it's in
9	the item itself, the location, but they prefer to
10	keep it so that nobody knows so they don't avoid
11	it.
12	LEGISLATOR FORD: Okay.
13	SERGEANT STEPHANOFF: So that it gets
14	the use. The intended use is to see what's going
15	on not to
16	LEGISLATOR FORD: To see where they're
17	going and everything. We look at now, this
18	Malaysian flight, they think that people go on
19	and put bombs, whatever it is, killing all those
20	people. So I guess maybe there is a benefit to
21	that too.
22	Thank you.
23	SERGEANT STEPHANOFF: I believe in the
24	item itself, the printed material, the location
25	is in there for you to view.
