21	Clerk Item 84-14 is an ordinance amending
22	ordinance Number 199-2011, an ordinance repealing
23	Ordinance Number 188-2010, as amended,
24	establishing fees to be charged by the Department
25	of Parks, Recreation and Museums, in relation to

3	passport; and making certain determinations
4	pursuant to the State Environmental Quality
5	Review Act.
6	LEGISLATOR DUNNE: So moved.
7	CHAIRMAN MACKENZIE: Second?
8	LEGISLATOR BIRNBAUM: I have a comment.
9	LEGISLATOR DUNNE: If I may. I wanted
10	to make a comment as well.
11	CHAIRMAN MACKENZIE: We just wanted to
12	point out that this was a bipartisan effort on
13	behalf of legislation proposed by Legislator
14	Birnbaum and amended to make some small changes
15	by the Majority. And we're very happy that both
16	sides of the aisle to take part in this
17	legislation to help veterans. It's going to help
18	Nassau County residents who are active duty
19	military or veterans to obtain county resident
20	leisure passes from the Department of Parks and
21	Recreation for a one-time fee of \$25. It would
22	be the same benefits conferred on people with
23	veterans' passport. The leisure passport was
24	limited to veterans only and required a \$25 fee
25	every three years. The proposed leisure passport

2	is more inclusive and would also include active
3	duty military personnel. And I apologize. Ms.
4	Birnbaum, if you would like to make some
5	comments.
6	LEGISLATOR BIRNBAUM: Thank you. Yes.
7	I'm proud to have brought this legislation forth.
8	It will now bring veterans in line with the
9	senior citizen's rates that are being charged.
10	The inclusion of active military personnel is
11	great. But I would recommend keeping the leisure
12	pass saying veterans and then having a separate
13	one for active military duty. That when those
14	active are no longer, they can convert to a
15	veteran's pass showing the proper identification.
16	CHAIRMAN MACKENZIE: I'm sorry. Just to
17	clarify. Can we have a motion?
18	LEGISLATOR DUNNE: So moved.
19	LEGISLATOR WALKER: Second.
20	CHAIRMAN MACKENZIE: Motion by
21	Legislator Dunne, and a second by Legislator
22	Walker.

2	MR. MAY: I just wanted to note that the
3	county executive's office is looking to work with
4	obviously both sides of the aisle on this. As
5	far as the active duty leisure pass, the language
6	that we're looking at is to make the active duty
7	military ID that our service men and women have,
8	that that would automatically count as a leisure
9	passport. That they would not have to pay a fee
10	or get a separate ID. They would go ahead and
11	use their active duty military ID.
12	CHAIRMAN MACKENZIE: Tell the county
13	executive thank you on behalf of
14	LEGISLATOR BIRNBAUM: I understand that.
15	But my point is that veterans are very proud to
16	have a card that says veterans. So many people
17	already do have that card that says veterans.
18	Just a separate card for the active military
19	duty, that when they're finished serving they can
20	then get a veterans one.
21	MR. MAY: Yes. We agree. It wouldn't
22	be in place of a veteran's passport. It would be
23	probably a separate line on the ordinance where
24	it would say active duty military personnel can
25	show their ID, no matter what branch of the

2	military they're from, and that would be, for all
3	intents and purposes, be a leisure passport.
4	Obviously, we have active duty military
5	stationed in Nassau County from all over the
6	country. It's just a benefit to our active duty
7	military personnel.
8	LEGISLATOR BIRNBAUM: Okay.
9	CHAIRMAN MACKENZIE: It's my
10	understanding we have a public speaker. Michael
11	Schlenoff from the Syosset American Legion.
12	MR. SCHLENOFF: Michael Schlenoff, 28
13	Parkway Drive, Syosset. I am the Vice Commander
14	and Judge Advocate of Post 1812 of the American
15	Legion and the Judge Advocate of Plainview Post
16	5942 of the VFW, and we are very much in favor of
17	this legislation.
18	CHAIRMAN MACKENZIE: Thank you, sir, for
19	coming here today.
