- 23 service and sacrifice we would not enjoy the
- 24 freedoms that we enjoy in these United
- 25 States. On behalf of a grateful nation, I

- 4 Let us now take a moment and
- 5 posthumously honor Joseph Pascarella, our
- 6 Veterans Service Agency Executive Director,
- 7 who passed away last year. A man I believe
- 8 was our finest director. A dedicated
- 9 veteran. Certainly dedicated to the
- 10 veterans of Nassau County. Joe leaves
- 11 behind a legacy of unparalleled service to
- 12 our veterans. Under his leadership the
- 13 Veterans Service Agency created
- 14 unprecedented housing opportunities for
- 15 returning veterans, single parent veterans
- 16 and active duty military.
- 17 According to data released by the
- 18 United States Veterans Administration,
- 19 counselors at the Nassau County Veterans
- 20 Service Agency significantly increased the
- 21 annual amount of cash awards received by
- 22 local veterans from under \$1 million in 2006
- 23 to \$9.3 million in 2013. The VSA is on pace
- 24 to secure a record breaking ten million plus
- 25 in benefits for local veterans this year.

- 9 recognized. His legacy will live on.
- 10 Tonight, I speak to you from The
- 11 Space, a new theater in the downtown village
- 12 of Westbury. Nassau County, in partnership
- 13 with Mayor Peter Cavallaro and the trustees
- 14 and Legislator Rich Nicolello, worked with
- 15 Cyrus Hakakian to establish this beautiful
- 16 new entertainment venue.
- 17 From this new theater to new
- 18 housing opportunities and stores, Westbury
- 19 is an example of reinventing and
- 20 revitalizing our downtown business
- 21 districts. It represents how Nassau County
- 22 insists on managing its future for the
- 23 betterment of every resident. I'd like to
- 24 recognize the mayor here tonight.
- 25 Friends, four years ago we

- 17 Office of Emergency Management for superior
- 18 response to Hurricane Sandy and other
- 19 weather events. Their efforts under crisis
- 20 were spectacular. Due to the efforts of our
- 21 first responders collectively under the
- 22 office of Emergency Management no lives were
- 23 lost during that powerful storm. In fact,
- 24 Nassau County received the prestigious

- 17 consolidating and establishing a
- 18 state-of-the-art training and education

- 20 training facilities. Some of the best in

- Scott, please stand and be

- 24 And Health Commissioner Larry
- 25 Eisenstein for his leadership in safely

- 3 in the face of Hurricane Sandy and for

- 10 professionals was is second to none.
- 11 Larry, please stand and be recognized.
- 12 Executive director Eldia
- 13 Gonsalves for her exemplary work leading the

- 15 Please stand and be recognized.
- 16 Parks commissioner and now our
- 17 county attorney, Carnell Foskey for
- 18 expending athletic and family entertainment
- 19 options, such as our fabulous free summer
- 20 concert series, Octoberfest, Barkfest,
- 21 candlelight nights, the Long Island Fair at
- 22 Old Bethpage Village Restoration and our
- 23 annual Cruise to the Show Car Show and
- 24 parade to name a few.
- Nassau County residents are using

- 22 administration's success in cutting
- 23 wasteful spending resulted in Nassau County
- 24 receiving Governor Cuomo's New York State
- 25 Government Efficiency Award as well as a \$5

- 3 I also want to recognize my
- 4 economic development team, I work with
- 5 them just about every day, led by Joe

- 10 Will Joe Kearney and our Economic
- 11 Development team please stand and be

- With the support of Presiding
- 14 Officer Norma Gonsalves, we have
- 15 tackled the decade old dilemma of
- 16 redeveloping the Hub by launching a 100
- 17 percent privately financed new Veterans
- 18 Memorial Coliseum and entertainment
- 19 district. The new coliseum will retain its
- 20 history of honoring our veterans while
- 21 sharing in revenue with the taxpayers,
- 22 employ 2,700 people and provide \$10 billion
- 23 in economic benefit to Nassau County, as
- 24 well as compliment Hofstra University and
- 25 Nassau Community College.

- 10 The transformed Coliseum is only

- 16 future as this economic development project
- 17 will enhance our quality of life and provide
- 18 job opportunities for residents.
- 19 No longer will Nassau County
- 20 residents pay the electric bill, pave the
- 21 parking lot or buy million dollar
- 22 scoreboards. These practices are not
- 23 sustainable and are personally nacceptable
- 24 to our administration.
- 25 Instead, county taxpayers will

- 12 Another public-private
- 13 partnership is underway at Old Bethpage

- 15 History Channel and philanthropist Lawrence
- 16 Kadish, we are establishing the Museum of
- 17 American Armor. This facility will not only
- 18 serve as a living museum and education
- 19 center, but it will be a vibrant and dynamic
- 20 tribute to the tens of thousands of US GIs
- 21 here in Nassau County who dedicated their
- 22 lives to protect our nation and the lives of
- 23 those who have faced tyranny around the
- world.
- The positive financial benefits

- To further our goal of curtailing
- 16 the brain drain, I have launched Nassau
- 17 200. This study builds on our current
- 18 efforts to attract and retain young
- 19 professionals in Nassau County. In the

- 21 a panel of 200 millenial opinion leaders.
- 22 They will be charged with the mission of
- 23 reversing the migration of crucial talent
- 24 off Long Island. From advising my cabinet,
- 25 to ratifying select plans and programs,

- 16 diverse businesses. It includes a
- 17 state-of-the-art Homeland Security Center,
- 18 housing opportunities and Nassau's newest
- 19 industry, film and TV production. Nassau
- 20 County has quickly become the Hollywood east
- 21 of the movie and television industry.
- 22 Thanks to the support of legislators Rich
- 23 Nicolello, Rose Walker and Denise Ford.
- 24 Collectively this industry
- 25 generated \$144 million in economic benefits

- 3 2,000 people. Nassau now has more
- 4 filming days than four of the five
- 5 boroughs put together and regularly
- 6 employs electricians, carpenters and
- 7 artisans.
- 8 Recently Carrie Underwood
- 9 performed a live television broadcast of the
- 10 Sound of Music on NBC right here in Nassau
- 11 County in Grumman studios. In fact, the
- 12 most expensive motion picture in history,
- 13 the Amazing Spider Man Two, was recently
- 14 filmed in Bethpage and will be released
- 15 in May.
- To continue growing jobs, I have
- 17 been in contact with the New York Institute
- 18 of Technology, Molloy College, Long Island
- 19 University and Start Up New York, and
- 20 together we are seeking to attract digital
- 21 post production editing here in Nassau
- 22 County companies in Nassau.
- It is initiatives such as these
- 24 that have strengthened our local economy.
- 25 Never again will the loss of a single

- 2 company such as Grumman be allowed to
- 3 assault our economy.
- 4 After shedding jobs for more than
- 5 ten years, good middle class jobs have
- 6 begun to return to Nassau County. We
- 7 stand here today with a record that
- 8 includes creating and retaining nearly 2,000
- 9 jobs and employment opportunities.
- 10 From the new Hain Celestial
- 11 headquarters in Lake Success, to attracting
- 12 a New York City lighting company bound for
- 13 LA, jobs are coming back to Nassau County.
- Just recently we announced that
- 15 manufacturers New York Vanity and Supreme
- 16 Screw both are moving from New York City to
- 17 Nassau. Manufactures medical screws.
- 18 Many local companies are also
- 19 expanding their operations including
- 20 employers such as Clever Devices, Arizona
- 21 Iced Tea, New York Community Bancorp,
- 22 Nassau Candy, the new beverage
- 23 manufacturer Agua Enerviva, R Best
- 24 Produce, parent company of Uncle Guisseppe's
- 25 moved their headquarters here as well as

- 3 My aggressive economic
- 4 development plan does not stop there.
- 5 Through public-private partnerships we are
- 6 making an economic future possible for
- 7 Nassau County that previously would have
- 8 been unimaginable.
- 9 Nassau County's economy is
- 10 clearly growing. In fact several weeks ago
- 11 the State Department of Labor released
- 12 statistics indicating a drop in unemployment
- 13 here in Nassau County to 5.1 percent. These
- 14 statistics remind us that our economic
- development and job creation policies are
- 16 working, as our employment rate is
- 17 considerably lower when compared
- 18 statewide and throughout the nation.
- 19 To connect employers with
- 20 residents, my administration has hosted
- 21 several extremely successful job fairs.
- 22 In fact, in November, more than 10,000
- 23 residents visited our free job fair at
- 24 the Nassau Veterans Memorial Coliseum.
- To further assist residents, I,

- 4 Phone app named Nassau Works. This app
- 5 lists tens of thousands of jobs available
- 6 for our residents, all on your smart phone

- 8 app today or visit Nassau Works dot com and
- 9 find a job opportunity, full time, part time
- 10 they are all there.
- 11 This application builds on our
- 12 success of our smart application, Nassau
- 13 Now, which provides an efficient way to
- 14 receive important emergency alerts as
- 15 well as to report neighborhood issues such
- 16 as downed trees, traffic hazards and, yes,
- 17 pot holes.
- The application allows you to
- 19 simply take a photo of the problem with
- 20 your smart phone and it is sent to my office
- 21 and the appropriate department for action.
- 22 It will give us the GPS coordinates as well.
- This application has been very
- 24 successful and recently was utilized to
- 25 correct a safety hazard reported by

- 2 Legislator Judy Jacobs, where we worked on
- 3 the issue and we swiftly address it. So
- 4 technology helps.
- 5 In addition to not raising real
- 6 property taxes, creating jobs and providing
- 7 new housing opportunities for our young
- 8 workforce, we have steadily improved
- 9 Nassau's finances through a renewed and
- 10 mutually respectful partnership with NIFA.
- 11 I want to recognize John Kaiman, chairman of
- 12 NIFA, for creating a cooperative,
- 13 progressive path to fiscal strength.
- 14 Historically, over the past
- 15 several decades, the county's budgetary fund
- 16 balance was used to measure its financial
- 17 operations. When I assumed office in 2010,
- 18 the county's fund balance was \$64 million.
- 19 The county's independently audited financial
- 20 statements for 2012 indicated that that fund
- 21 balance had increased 28 percent to \$82
- 22 million.
- This positive trend will continue
- 24 when we receive our 2013 audited financial
- 25 statements in the coming months, and we

- 2 believe that the fund balance will grow to
- 3 over \$100 million, steadily increasing our
- 4 fiscal growth.
- 5 As agreed to with NIFA, Nassau
- 6 County is transitioning to a reporting on
- 7 a more stringent accounting basis. In 2012,
- 8 the county reported a \$27.5 million surplus
- 9 on a GAAP basis and continues to show
- 10 improvement with respect to the NIFA
- 11 statute test. Which is an even more
- 12 conservative test than the GAAP reporting
- 13 standard.
- 14 This positive financial news is
- 15 the result of extraordinary cost-cutting
- 16 efforts. The good news in Nassau is that
- 17 these affirmative actions undertaken by
- 18 this administration have firmly placed
- 19 Nassau County on the road to fiscal
- 20 recovery. However, more work needs to be
- 21 accomplished to comply with NIFA's new
- 22 accounting standard, which basically
- 23 eliminates certain revenue items.
- The single greatest obstacle to
- 25 meeting this standard is Nassau County's

- 3 nearly one half of Nassau County's \$3
- 4 billion debt. Nassau County is the only
- 5 county in New York State to guarantee
- 6 returning money it has never received.
- 7 This hurts every single taxpayer
- 8 in our county. I have endeavored to correct
- 9 this bizarre and destructive rule. Recently
- 10 the Court of Appeals has made it clear that
- 11 only New York State Legislature can correct
- 12 this waste it.
- 13 Accordingly, I have met with
- 14 state officials, NIFA and Kevin Law of the
- 15 LIA, with us here today, and we will work
- 16 together to draft legislation that will
- 17 correct this billion dollar wasteful system
- 18 and build the consensus necessary to get it
- 19 passed because it places an unconscionable
- 20 burden on every county taxpayer. Hurts you.
- 21 Hurts your home value. Hurts our economy
- 22 and hurts our commercial values.
- As we move forward I call on all
- 24 the stakeholders to work together to end
- 25 the present system, end the billion

- 2 dollar waste and treat Nassau County
- 3 taxpayers as other taxpayers are treated
- 4 throughout New York State. We ask for
- 5 nothing more but will insist on nothing
- 6 less.
- 7 Successfully reinventing and
- 8 revolutionizing Nassau County has been a
- 9 challenge. However, rebuilding our great
- 10 county is an even greater challenge due to
- 11 the damage inflicted on our residents,
- 12 property and infrastructure by Hurricane
- 13 Sandy.
- 14 It speaks to the strength of our
- 15 residents that we have stood against that
- 16 storm and come back from its historic
- 17 devastation. But it took a team of men and
- 18 women who ignored partisan labels and
- 19 displayed extraordinary leadership to help
- 20 Nassau County at a time of crisis.
- 21 Together with Governor Cuomo,
- 22 Majority Leader Dean Skelos, US senators
- 23 Schumer and Gillibrand and Congressmen
- 24 King and Israel, we have made certain
- 25 that unaffected property owners don't

- 24 \$830 million to rebuild an even stronger Bay
- 25 Park Waste Water Treatment Plant which

- 3 Today, the advocacy for federal
- 4 dollars continues as again I join forces
- 5 with Governor Cuomo, Senator Schumer and
- 6 a dozen environmental groups to obtain

- 9 Historically and presently, Bay
- 10 Park Waste Water Treatment Plant
- 11 discharges effluent directly into
- 12 Reynolds Channel. I want to move this
- 13 discharge two miles out into the ocean,
- 14 thus protecting our environment and
- 15 increasing recreational boating and
- 16 commercial fishing opportunities as well
- 17 as strengthening our economy.
- I remain optimistic and committed
- 19 to fighting for the outfall pipe for
- 20 Nassau County residents along with the
- 21 legislators that stand with me today. A
- 22 stronger, smarter and more resilient Nassau
- 23 County is in our future and will be a
- 24 reality.
- Nassau County is the safest large

- 3 happy to report that statistics tell us
- 4 it is even safer today. Police
- 5 Commissioner Krumpter and the Nassau
- 6 County Police Department have reduced crime
- 7 by 14 percent year to date. Crime is down
- 8 by over 11 percent since this administration
- 9 took office in 2010.
- Nassau's intelligence-led
- 11 policing model is a model other police
- 12 departments from across the nation are
- 13 studying as it combines good old fashion
- 14 police work with state-of-the-art technology
- 15 and best practices.
- 16 From a zero tolerance for
- 17 domestic violence to our ground breaking
- 18 active shooter seminars, Nassau County
- 19 Police Department is making certain our

- 25 MacKenzie, this year every school will be

- 10 medications and her family was able to
- 11 administer Narcan and was able to save her
- 12 life.
- But it starts with our youth and

- 15 grateful we have some wonderful high school
- 16 students who participated in a wonderful
- 17 program. I want to recognize the many
- 18 students who joined our efforts to prevent
- 19 heroin use by creating a public service
- 20 announcements for their peers.
- 21 We have with us tonight
- 22 MacArthur, Valley Stream South, Division and
- 23 Hewlett High School students. Please stand
- 24 and be recognized.
- To keep our county secure and

- 3 workforce, we plan to hire approximately 125
- 4 police officers a year for the next three
- 5 year or four years. These officers will
- 6 replace retiring officers and continue the

- 9 With the support of former
- 10 Legislator Joseph Scannell and now
- 11 Legislator Laura Curran, we have begun
- 12 construction of a new state-of-the-art First
- 13 Precinct to replace the dilapidated falling
- 14 apart facility in Baldwin on county property
- 15 that will be owned by Nassau County.
- 16 Friends, there is much more. We
- 17 have improved our parks through smart
- 18 cost-saving partnerships that provide
- 19 free entertainment for our residents,
- 20 affordable camps for our children and
- 21 have continued the games for the
- 22 physically challenged by raising the
- 23 necessary funds from local residents and
- 24 good corporate citizens.
- We have honored our veterans and
