SERGEANT STEPHANOFF: 212-14 is a grant for \$130,000 from DCJS. It's surveillance, apprehension, vehicle enforcement. This grant is going to focus on insurance fraud for stolen vehicles, and it's going to be mostly money spent with detectives following up on cases.

the County of Nassau, acting on behalf of the
district attorney's office and Family &
Children's Association, Inc.

MR. MCMANUS: Yes. Thank you.

CHAIRMAN DUNNE: And we have a motion by Mr. MacKenzie, seconded by Legislator Ford.

MR. MCMANUS: This is a grant agreement between the district attorney's office and the Family & Children's Association and the Women's Opportunity Rehabilitation Center to provide counseling services and employment services for women recently released from incarceration.

The program is intended to reduce recidivism and to increase the chances for positive reintegration to the community.

This program bears no cost to the county and is financed by discretionary federal forfeiture funds.

CHAIRMAN DUNNE: Thank you. I hope it works.

2	Last year it was financed by a specific grant.
3	But yes, it is a continuing program.
4	LEGISLATOR FORD: Okay. Thank you.
5	Do you also, with this program, the
6	thought just crossed my mind on this. Do you
7	also then look to see, you know, with these
8	women, to see if you can get them job placement
9	anywhere or type of training?
10	MR. SCHENK: Yes. Employment training
11	and placement is an integral part of the program.
12	LEGISLATOR FORD: I'd like to send over,
13	just as an aside, there is a organization called
14	New in Manhattan.
15	MR. SCHENK: Okay.
16	LEGISLATOR FORD: And they train women
17	for non-traditional employment and can also
18	assist in hopefully getting some of these women
19	meaningful employment. So I'd like to send it
20	over to your office and Kathleen Rice's office so
21	she's aware of this, okay?
22	MR. SCHENK: That will be great. I'll

MR. SCHENK: That will be great. I'll follow up tomorrow.
